Dear CV Community,



## Capital Project Update

The Phase 1 portion of the Capital Improvements Project is progressing very well. We received a timely review of the project by the State Education Department, and were able to get the project out to bid on schedule. The bidding was very successful with the total of all bids coming in less than what we had estimated. District staff, contractors, architects/engineers, and construction administrators meet on a regular basis to ensure the project is advancing appropriately. Our goal is to have the majority of the work completed this summer. Specific work that will be occurring over the summer includes the following:

- Bus loop and sidewalk replacement at Port Dickinson
- Parking lot replacement at Chenango Bridge
- Rear drive replacement at CV Middle School/High School
- Roof replacement at Port Dickinson
- Softball/multi-purpose field parking lot pavement
- Stadium lighting
- Masonry restoration at all buildings

As previously planned, the window replacement at Chenango Bridge and Port Dickinson is scheduled to occur in the summer of 2019, due to the time it takes to manufacture the windows.

The Phase 2 portion of the project is also progressing well. With the design concept portion complete, our architect/engineer is currently developing the construction documents which will be submitted to the State Education Department for review at the end of the summer. The goal is to have the project out for bidding by the end of 2018 so construction can begin in 2019.

If you have a child who will be four or five years old by December 1, 2018, please call the appropriate number below to be placed on a mailing list to receive registration information for pre-K or kindergarten.

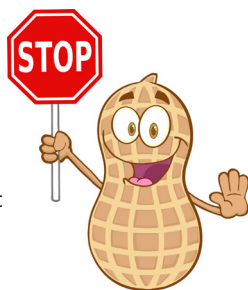

## CV High School Students Compete in 'Feats of Clay'

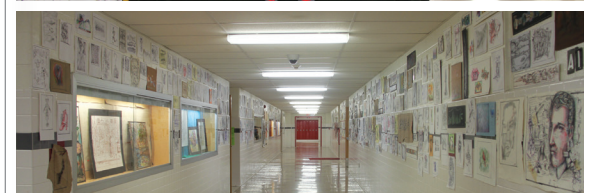

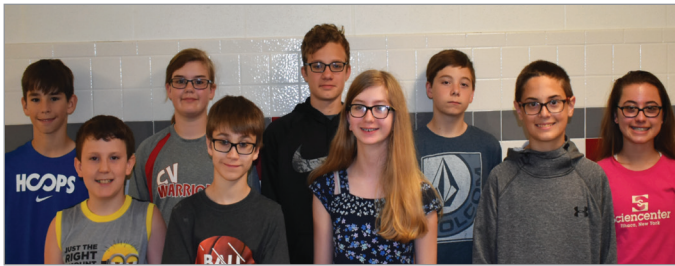

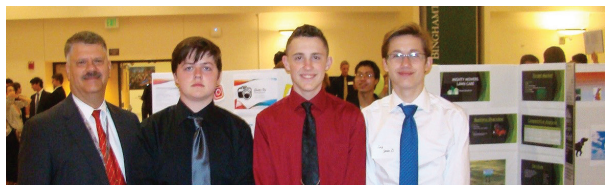

## Latin Club Explores New York City Art Museums

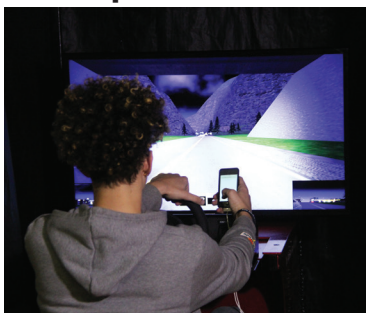

## 'International Save a Life Tour' Stops at CVHS

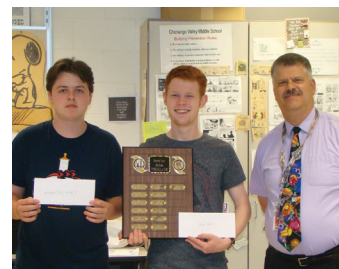
