WELCOME BACK, WARRIORS!

Emergency Alert System

The district uses an automated system to quickly send messages in the event of a school or district emergency. For typical school opening delays and closings, messages will be sent in the form of an email and/or text to your cell phone. To receive messages, you will need to have an up-to-date account set up through our district website.

To access this system on our district website:

- 1. Go to www.cvcsd.stier.org
- 2. Select "Public Login" at the top right-hand corner of the page (for desktop computers) or a grey box that says "Register to Receive School Closings/Alert Messages"
- 3. Log in or create a new account by choosing "Register New User"
- 4. Select the notification preferences you would like to receive (Emergency Alerts, Athletics, etc.) Choose one or more schools from the list to receive notifications pertaining specifically to the school(s) of your choice. To receive notifications for district-wide emergencies, which include weather-related school closings and delays, select "Emergency Alerts/Closing and Delay"



We encourage you to check and make sure that you're signed up. If your contact information has changed, please update it in the system as needed to ensure you receive notifications.

Capital Project Update

Construction activities continued in many of our district facilities over the summer. The Port Dickinson Elementary building (770 Chenango Street) was vacated entirely and contractors started the demolition process which included work on floor, ceiling, casework, plumbing fixtures and light removal. Once demolition was completed, new wall substrates and plaster were installed in the corridors, new electrical wiring was set up, and new plumbing piping was put in various locations. New windows and finishes within the rooms have also started to be installed. The construction has been progressing on schedule. As a reminder, Port Dickinson Elementary (pre-K - grade 2) students and staff are anticipated to return to the 770 Chenango Street Port Dickinson Elementary building in January 2020, immediately following our Winter Recess.

At the Chenango Bridge Elementary building (741 River Road), windows throughout the facility were replaced with energy-efficient windows. This replacement has also greatly improved the exterior look of the building. This is just the beginning of the work at this building. Starting in January 2020, once our Port Dickinson Elementary students and staff have returned to 770 Chenango Street, final capital project renovations on the Chenango Bridge Elementary building will commence. As a reminder, our Chenango Bridge Elementary (grades 3-5) students and staff will be at 1051 Chenango Street (the St. Francis School building) throughout the entire 2019-20 school year. CB students and staff are anticipated to return to their newly-renovated 741 River Road building in September 2020.

At CV Middle/High School, work included renovations to the library, refinishing of the gym floor, HVAC improvements at the middle school gym, the set up of serving lines, and the creation of gender-neutral toilet rooms and shower areas. While some of the work is still wrapping up, these renovations have greatly improved the use of these spaces. The construction of our new CV Middle School/High School outdoor classroom has also started. This facility will be located at the storm water pond adjacent to the softball field. Utilities have been run underground to the building and the foundations have been installed.

We appreciate your patience, understanding and cooperation as we go through the renovation process. We look forward to seeing our renovated facilities and all of the amazing educational opportunities that each will provide.








Summer Swim Lessons Create a Wave of Fun and Learning

Title I, Parents' Right to Know Notification Letter

To Port Dickinson, Chenango Bridge and Chenango Valley Middle School Parents/Guardians,

In accordance with the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), parents of students attending Title I schools – Port Dickinson, Chenango Bridge and Chenango Valley Middle School - may request information regarding the professional qualifications of your child's teachers and paraprofessional staff.

Please call the District Office at 762-6810 should you want information regarding:

- A. whether the teacher has met State qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction;
- B. whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which State qualification or licensing criteria have been waived;
- C. the baccalaureate degree major of the teacher and any other graduate certification or degree held by the teacher, and the field of discipline of the certification or degree; and
- D. whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.

Chenango Valley Central School District Request for Pesticide Application Notification

New York State Education Law Section 409-H and State Education Department Commissioner's Regulation 155.24, effective July 1, 2001, requires all public and nonpublic elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation, faculty and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the school year.

Chenango Valley Central School District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation, faculty and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior notification of certain pesticide applications.

If you would like to receive such notification or would like further information regarding this matter, please contact Director of School Facilities and Operations Mr. Andrew Burlingame at (607) 762-6861.

Public Notice Regarding Asbestos

The Chenango Valley Central School District completes inspection of all schools and buildings to determine the condition of asbestos that is present, and whether any action is required to avoid potential health hazards for students, employees and visitors.

A management plan has been developed in accordance with the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), to ensure the continued provision and maintenance of a safe environment for students, employees and visitors. The management plan includes training of maintenance staff to prevent disturbance of asbestos, periodic re-inspection, surveillance and limited abatement by trained personnel.

Please note that the comprehensive, triennial inspection occurs once every three years. A surveillance inspection of the asbestos containing building materials occurs every six months, typically during the months of December and July. Monitoring of these building materials occurs on a continuing basis.






My School Menu Online

These greetings were a great way to start the school day, build connections and inspire **#CVWarriorPride**!






Locker Notes Spread Messages of Positivity
