Assessment Review

Issue: Using state assessment data to drive instructional pedagogy

Baseline Data: State Assessments, Regional Data, and District Data (core subject areas)

Strategies: Use state data to address deficiencies (when noted)
Develop district level assessment data
 By general education
 By special education
 By economically disadvantaged
Use district data to focus efforts on key areas
Conduct curricular gap analysis on state exams
Utilize gap analysis to adjust our instruction

Curriculum Review

Issue: The state is requiring a unified set of core standards for ELA and Math curriculums for implementation by September, 2011.

Baseline Data: Review of ELA and Math district curriculums

Strategies:

- Develop unified ELA and Math core curriculums
- Create grade level curriculum maps
- Review new core standards for ELA and Math
- Align core standards with curriculum maps
- Finalize horizontal curriculum maps
- Finalize vertical alignment of curriculum maps
- Utilize assessment gap analysis to adjust final district-wide curriculums for ELA and Math

Finance Review

Issue: Maintaining financial stability for the long range funding plan of the Chenango Valley Central School District

Baseline Data: Long Range Plan, Fund Balances, Aid Reports, and Auditing Reports

Strategies:

- Continuing to utilize a needs based budget
- Monthly monitoring
 - Budget status
 - State aid
 - Fund balance (projections)
- Utilize annual external auditing to monitor and adjust financial planning and/or practices
- Conducting bi-annual long range financial plan

Special Education Review

Issue: We are being warned that our special needs sub-group at the 4th grade was not meeting annual yearly progress.

Baseline Data: 2010 NYS 3-8 ELA Exam

Strategies:

- Data huddles to find areas of difficulty.
- Focusing on reading level work
- Whisper reading for testing skills
- Student test taking skills
- Data indicates “Poetry” was challenging
- Will focus first on the biggest challenge
- Use AIS, RTI, CST data to assist in early identification of struggling students
- Offering before school tutoring
- Utilize practice ELA to gather data & adjust

Special Education Review

Issue: The current dynamics of special education instruction is changing and we will need to review the best options to address these offerings in the district.

Baseline Data: Testing Results, NYS Exam Results, CSE Reviews, and Observations

Strategies:

- Collaborate with other successful programs
- Reviewing programmatic options
 - Push In, Pull Out, Modified, Etc.
- Exploring a self-contained classroom option
- Collaborate with our staff to maximize our overall program

Transportation Review

Issue: Identifying areas within the transportation department to enhance the effectiveness and overall safety while transporting our students.

Baseline Data: Arrival and Dismissal Data, Routing Data, Accident Data, Monthly Data Report

Strategies:

- Identify past department deficiencies with DMV
- Rectify all past deficiencies with DMV
- Continue to use Transfinder to maximize efficiency
- Research building start and end times
- Provide professional development for bus drivers
- Explore new communication and safety platforms
- Explore transportation system options

Facility Review

Issue: Identifying and prioritizing the operation and maintenance needs of the district on a continuing basis.

Baseline Data: Building Condition Survey (BCS), 5 Year Capital Facilities Plan, Work Orders

Strategies:

- Conduct mandatory BCS
- Research use of facility management program
- Develop and monitor monthly operation reports
- Developing an organizational structure plan for district and building operations and responsibilities
- Utilize BCS to id and correct maintenance issues
- Utilize BCS for possible (zero cost) “excel project”
- Develop 5 year capital facilities plan
- Implement long range capital plan for the district
