New Visions: New Visions is a college/career exploration program for highly motivated college-bound seniors. Students are selected based on a rigorous application and interview process. There are 5 academies: Business, Education, Engineering, Health and Law & Government. In each area students go on professional placements shadowing and observing professionals in the field. The rest of the program is spent on coursework, including College English, Economics, College Public Policy via Syracuse University, and a core course in the area of concentration.
