Library Proposition



According to Section 529 of New York State Education Law, libraries within the boundaries of a school district have the right to place a separate funding proposition on the district's ballot. The law provides this as a means for libraries to access community voters and levy taxes.

In May 2014, the Chenango Valley community participated in its first vote to support a proposition to provide annual funding to the Fenton Free Library. The Chenango Valley Board of Education was requested to add a proposition to the 2021 ballot to increase the annual funding to \$125,772.

It is important to note that library funds and school district funds remain separate, and the school district does not have any role in funding, operations or management of the library.

The proposition will be worded as follows:

Shall the proposition be approved authorizing the Board of Education of the Chenango Valley Central School District to levy taxes annually in the amount of One Hundred and Twenty Five Thousand Seven Hundred Seven Two Dollars (\$125,772) and to pay over such monies to the trustees of the Fenton Free Library for the purpose of funding the Fenton Free Library?

Bus Proposition



Voters will be asked to consider a proposition to purchase three (3) 66-passenger buses and two (2) sport utility vehicles (SUVs) at a total cost not to exceed \$460,000.

Chenango Valley has a fleet of approximately 30 buses and 4 SUVs, with a long-range plan to replace an average of three buses each year as they reach 10 years and/or 100,000 miles.

Transportation Aid Reimbursement

Bus purchases, including finance costs, are aided at the district's transportation aid ratio which is expected to be at 88.4% in 2021-2022.

The proposition will be worded as follows:

Shall the Chenango Valley Central School District, Broome County, New York, be authorized to purchase school buses, including costs incidental thereto, at a total maximum estimated cost of Four Hundred Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$460,000), and that such sum shall be raised by the levy of a tax upon the taxable property of said School District to be collected in annual installments as provided by Section 416 of the Education Law; and in anticipation of such tax, obligations of said School District shall be issued?

New Capital Reserve Proposition

School districts use capital reserves to set aside funds for future capital projects. Chenango Valley has used our existing capital reserve over the past 10 years to reduce the tax levy impact of capital projects on our tax paying community. That reserve was set up with a 10 year term, so it can no longer be used to begin saving for future projects. We are recommending establishing a new capital reserve to be set up with a term of 20 years to cover projects in the future. Chenango Valley plans to use the remaining funds in the existing reserve to reduce the tax burden on a new project that will be up for public vote in December 2021. This new capital reserve that is being proposed is projected to be used for any new projects that may occur over the next 20 years.

The proposition will be worded as follows:

Shall the Board of Education of the Chenango Valley Central School District be authorized to establish a capital reserve fund pursuant to Section 3651 of the Education Law to be designated "School Facilities Reserve Fund 2021" in order to pay costs of the construction, reconstruction and/or improvements of School Facilities, including original equipment, machinery, apparatus, appurtenances, furnishings, site improvements, land or rights-in-land, and other incidental improvements and expenses in connection therewith, and, in order to accomplish the same, said Board is hereby authorized to establish the ultimate amount of such Reserve Fund to be \$20,000,000 plus accrued interest and other investment earnings thereon with a probable term of twenty years and, to appropriate annually from available fund balance and/or other legally available funds of the School District to such Reserve Fund?

Message from the Superintendent and Board President

Dear Chenango Valley Community,

We are pleased to present you with the 2021-2022 Chenango Valley Central School District budget proposal. As we continue to navigate the circumstances presented by the pandemic, our students remain at the forefront of all decision-making, while we also carefully consider our stakeholders and current economic standing.

Districts nationwide have felt the impact of the pandemic on school budgets. We cannot ignore challenges such as unfunded mandates, tax levy limits, and escalating costs at a time where economic resources are limited. However, our students need us to advocate for their success. It is important that we continue to work towards solutions to provide them the best education possible and light the way for a positive future, including college and career readiness.

Our budget proposal continues to include a small capital project that allows us to take advantage of significant state reimbursements that will be received in the following year. This means we'll be able to complete a capital project at a value of \$100,000 and a net cost of about \$12,200 (see "Annual Small Capital Outlay Project" below for further information).

The tax levy limit law enacted in 2011 by New York State requires districts to apply an eight-step formula to determine the highest allowable tax levy increase a district can propose, which requires approval of a "simple majority" (more than 50 percent) of voters. If districts choose to propose a tax levy increase above this calculated amount, a "super majority" (more than 60 percent) of voters must approve the plan. This year, our calculated tax limit is 1.34 percent (%).

We invite and encourage residents to attend our annual budget hearing/meet the school board candidates forum on Wednesday, May 5, at 6:00 p.m. Information from this event will also be posted on our district website.

The district's budget vote and school board election will be held on Tuesday, May 18, from 12:00 (noon) - 8:00 p.m. in the Chenango Valley Middle School/High School Auditorium. Voters must follow safety protocols including wearing a face mask and practicing social distancing. Annual Small Capital Outlay Project

The capital outlay project that the district completes every year has been very beneficial in allowing us to continue capital improvement work. These projects are capped at \$100,000, and the district receives aid back from NY State the following year. This is reflected in the budget as a "transfer to capital" of \$100,000.

Our 2021-2022 building aid ratio will be increasing to 87.8%, resulting in a net cost of approximately \$12,200. For 2021-2022, we are planning to complete some additional improvements to the exterior of Chenango Bridge Elementary School. The scope includes a new roof canopy to provide some shelter at the main entrance as well as other improvements to enhance the entrance area.

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

Tax Levy Calculation and Impact

The calculated tax levy limit for the 2021-2022 school year is 1.34%. The impact of this increase on a home valued at \$100,000 would be approximately \$38.

Every homeowner's tax bill is impacted by changes in equalization rates that are assigned by New York State (NYS) to every town each summer prior to school tax bills being calculated. As a result of that change, each town in our school district will see a different impact on their tax bill depending on their town's change in equalization rate relative to other towns in the state. Absentee Ballots:

Absentee ballot applications may be obtained through District Clerk Susan Cirba by calling (607) 762-6812. Voters must verify eligibility and provide an eligible reason for their inability to vote in person. For this year, one reason does include concerns related to COVID-19. Absentee ballot applications must be requested at least seven (7) days prior to the date of the vote and the returned ballot must be received no later than 5:00 p.m. on the day of the vote. The district will automatically mail absentee ballots to voters listed as "permanently disabled" on the Board of Election's list. For more information, please call Susan Cirba at (607) 762-6812.

Voter Eligibility:

To vote, you must be:

- 18 years of age or older
- a U.S. citizen, and
- a resident of the school district for at least 30 days (proof of residency is required: NYS driver's license, sheriff's ID card, senior citizen ID card or utility bill indicating residency)

What if the Budget Doesn't Pass?

The board of education will either:

- (1) Make changes to the budget and hold a second vote. It should be noted that if the budget doesn't pass the second time, the only remaining option would be to adopt a contingency budget as outlined in number 2 below.
- (2) Adopt a contingency budget. If a contingency budget is adopted, \$107,000 in equipment purchases would be eliminated and a total of \$180,500 in additional cuts would have to be made.

REMINDER: Meal Distribution Available for Remote Learners (Includes both 100% remote learners and students who are temporarily remote due to quarantine, etc.)

Meals for all remote students can be picked up on Wednesday mornings between 8:00 and 9:00 a.m. at the Chenango Valley Middle School/High School security entrance. (If there is a one or two-hour delay on a scheduled distribution date, distribution will be available from 9:00 to 10:00 a.m. If there is a snow day on a scheduled distribution date, distribution is postponed to the next day.)

How to Schedule a Pick-Up: If your child is a remote learner and you wish to take advantage of the free meals, you must call Chenango Valley Food Services at (607) 762-6840 or (607) 762-6928 by 12:00 p.m. on Tuesday to schedule for pick-up on Wednesday.

Information for Temporarily Remote Students: If your child is temporarily remote (due to quarantine, etc.), please provide the anticipated date range that meals would be needed (ex: February 1 – February 8) when you call CV Food Services. Remote meals are only to be provided to students for the dates they are not learning in person. If your child must go temporarily remote at a time that does not correspond with the weekly meal distribution, please call CV Food Services and we will work with you.

Port Dickinson Elementary (Grades: Kindergarten - 2)

We have finally made it to spring! It is great to see more sunshine, warmer temperatures, and longer daylight each day. There are many important, exciting events at Port Dickinson Elementary School. Our highlights are as follows:

- The "Positivity Project" ("P2") is always a huge part of our school culture. This year's theme is "#PositivityInAction." With this mindset, our students connected with residents of a local nursing home facility. For Christmas/winter holidays, Valentine's Day, and spring, they have made cards and colored pictures to send to these very special people.
- Our students have participated in virtual experiences through a program called "Ag (Agriculture) in the Classroom." Students have learned how to make butter and ice cream, and also learned about apples. We are very thankful to be connected with Cornell Cooperative Extension Broome County as a community partner. Chenango Valley Middle School (Grades: 6-8)

Capital Project Update

Chenango Valley Central School District serves as the center of our community and we have a long-standing tradition of providing our students and community with well-maintained facilities and grounds. We work hard to design capital projects that enhance the learning spaces for our students and staff, in addition to providing meaningful extracurricular spaces. The CV Board of Education is currently evaluating a potential capital project that would be presented for public vote this December. The potential \$20 million project would address top-priority capital improvements that would help to ensure the longevity of our facilities. With the use of the district's new 87.8% state aid ratio, this project would maintain the current tax levy to the community, meaning there would not be an increase to the local tax burden.

The major focus of the project would be renovations at the CV Middle School/High School campus, which hasn't had a major renovation in 20 years.


Potential items that are being considered at the CV Middle School/High School campus include:

- Building systems upgrades (including LED lighting and fire alarm system)
- Classroom upgrades (including furniture replacement and interactive TVs)
- STEAM room, technology room, art room, and Home & Careers room renovations
- Auditorium sound system and stage lighting replacement
- Roof replacement
- Pavement replacement and parking lot expansion
- Tennis court replacement
- Installation of lights at the multipurpose field

Minor renovations are also planned for the elementary schools, including:

- Mechanical upgrades
- Gym lighting and sound system replacement
- Elevator upgrades

As the planning process progresses, we will conduct public information sessions and building tours to obtain feedback from community members. 

Public Notice

The Chenango Valley Central School District has completed the inspection of all schools and buildings to determine the condition of asbestos that is present, and whether any action is required to avoid potential health hazards for students, employees and visitors. A management plan has been developed in accordance with the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), to ensure the continued provision and maintenance of a safe environment for students, employees and visitors. The management plan includes training of maintenance staff to prevent disturbance of asbestos, periodic re-inspection, surveillance, and limited abatement by trained personnel.

Please note that the comprehensive, triennial inspection occurs once every three years. A surveillance inspection of the asbestos-containing building materials occurs every six months, typically during the months of December and July. Monitoring of these building materials occurs on a continuing basis. A copy of the management plan is available at the district office. Request for Pesticide Application Notification

New York State Education Law Section 409-H and State Education Department Commissioner's Regulation 155.24, effective July 1, 2001, requires all public and non-public elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the school year.

Chenango Valley Central School District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior notification of certain pesticide applications. CVHS Students Participate in 'Engineering Day'




