Capital Project Update

After many months of planning for the Phase II portion of the latest capital project, construction is now underway. The project's main emphasis is a major overhaul of the interiors of Port Dickinson and Chenango Bridge elementary schools. The results of the elementary school construction will be similar to what was completed at CV Middle School/High School in the early 2000s - fresh, new looking buildings that we can all be proud of. At both buildings, new floors, ceilings, lights, cabinetry, doors and furniture will be installed. At Port Dickinson, there will also be renovation work to create a new STEAM classroom, nurse's office, instructional space at the former locker rooms, and toilet rooms on the first and second floor levels. At Chenango Bridge, renovations will additionally include a new nurse's office, conference space and STEAM classroom.


As a reminder, due to the extent of the renovations at both elementary school buildings, students will be moved out of the buildings so work can be completed on schedule. The work will be completed much quicker and will be less disruptive to normal school operations than if it was completed while the buildings were occupied. Port Dickinson Elementary students (entering pre-K – grade 2) will be occupying the Chenango Bridge school building (741 River Road) from September through December 2019, and will return to their PD building (770 Chenango St.) in January 2020. Construction will begin at Chenango Bridge in January 2020 and will be completed by September 2020. Chenango Bridge Elementary students (entering grades 3-5) will be relocated to the St. Francis school building (1051 Chenango St.) for the entire 2019-2020 school year.

Work will also be occurring at CV Middle School/High School over the summer months. This work includes renovation of the library, freshening up of the CV High School gym and some additional toilet rooms. An outdoor classroom will also be constructed by the pond at the rear of the building, and is scheduled for completion at the end of the year.

Thank you for your patience and understanding as we undertake these important projects at our schools. We understand that moving our pre-K through grade 5 students around will cause some inconvenience, but we are positive that the end result will be two beautiful elementary buildings that will give our children even more opportunities to succeed and thrive.

What is The Positivity Project (P2)?

- Chenango Valley is excited to begin implementing a character strength education program called The Positivity Project (or “P2”) throughout the district beginning in the 2019-20 school year.
- The program is focused around positive psychology’s scientifically-validated 24 character strengths, and students will discover ways to execute/recognize these strengths in themselves and others to help build stronger relationships with their peers.
- A P2 calendar identifying weekly focus areas will be incorporated in the 2019-20 district calendar that is mailed to Chenango Valley Central School District families.
- The program’s “hashtag” is #OtherPeopleMatter. It asks students to reflect on the “Other People Matter” mindset:

1. Identifying and appreciating the good in others.
2. Knowing that my words and actions affect others.
3. Supporting others when they struggle.
4. Cheering others on when they succeed.
5. Being present and giving others my attention.

Child Care Resources in Our Community

One of the biggest challenges for parents during the summer and school year is child care. This is one of the most important decisions families make, and it can be very stressful when searching for a person who will be able to provide a safe environment that keeps your child engaged and learning.

At Chenango Valley, we have a before and after-school program for school-aged children called Fun Club that is offered to all of our families through the Binghamton Boys and Girls Club. The program is held at one of the elementary schools and runs from 6:30 a.m. until the start of school. The program then starts again at the end of the school day and runs until 6:10 p.m. Families must drop off their children in the morning and pick up their children at the end of the day for this program.

If you are able to stay home during the school day, have you ever thought about becoming a child-care provider during the school year or during the summer? Data shows that we are in need of child-care providers right in our Chenango Valley area. Family Enrichment Network is able to walk you through the process of state licensure, allowing you to offer child-care services right in your own home. They will assist you with starting your own business and offer free referrals to parents in our area looking for child care.

Important Message from our Health Office


Enriched 10 Students Share Non-Fiction History Books

'Ice Cream Social and Band Concert' a Sweet Treat for All




