

## Board of Education President's Message

On behalf of the Chenango Valley Board of Education, I would like to start by thanking our administration, faculty, staff, students and families for their resilience, tenacity, dedication and hard work over the past few months while facing unprecedented challenges. I would also like to thank the community for your continued support in passing the 2020-2021 budget, bus propositions, as well as allowing Joel Luchun and I to serve another term.

Although in-person meetings were put on hold, our governance team continued to meet via open-meeting Zooms. There was work to be done and difficult decisions to be made. We focused our attention on the health and safety of our staff and students and the transition to a distance learning model. Our attention will now be focused on reopening schools while continuing to make health and safety a priority. Due to the fact that 47% of our District's funding comes from State Aid, we will be following guidance/mandates from the State and may be limited in what we are able to do in order to remain in compliance. Our best success will come from unity.

To assist our work at Chenango Valley, I attended two recent webinars. The first highlighted the implications that the enacted 2020-2021 NYS budget would have on school districts. A few main points were: Foundation Aid stayed flat, there was a \$95.6 million increase in traditional formula-based aid which is only a 0.35% increase, STAR kept the same income eligibility, and the Revenue Reduction Plan included three reassessment periods (4/30, 6/30, 12/31) which can result in our State Aid being significantly impacted (therefore, it would be prudent for districts to keep in mind the possibility of mid-year cuts when adopting a budget). We heeded the advice and are not using any reserves. Another webinar was "COVID-19: Addressing New Challenges, New Issues, New Questions." In this webinar, Acting Commissioner Tahoe and Deputy Secretary Fuller discussed Regents exams, assisting schools with technology and flexibility of smart bonds, 180 day requirements, special education guidelines and compensatory services and distance learning plans emphasizing ALL students need to receive continuity of learning.

The Board of Regents and the New York State Education Department created four regional task forces to help develop guidance and regulatory changes to enable our schools to continue to safely educate our students. I was honored to be selected to serve on this task force. We met virtually and listened to experts in the field and then broke out into subgroups (Health & Safety; Transportation, Facility & Nutrition; Teaching and Learning; Digital Equity & Access; Budget and Fiscal; Social-Emotional Needs; Special Education; Bilingual Education/Multilingual Learners/Bilingual Learners; and Staffing/Human Resources). We discussed the greatest challenges schools would have in the three instructional models: in-person, remote or combination. We discussed creative solutions to these challenges and also how the Regents and Department can help eliminate budgetary and regulatory obstacles. The Regents assured us they will listen and use the information learned in providing guidelines for reopening schools.

Our students have been excellent examples of the importance to consistently exemplify integrity and work together. This school year presented unique challenges and opportunities. We, as a District, planned things that would help all of our students celebrate their accomplishments: parades, signs, adopt-a-senior, a graduation plan with family input, and all of the individual things our staff did at all levels. Congratulations to our Senior Class. May the lessons you learned here help to guide you in the future. Bernice Johnson Reagon, a civil rights activist, once said, "Life's challenges are not supposed to paralyze you. They're supposed to help you discover who you are." We are in the midst of challenges in our world and I believe we can find great comfort in knowing that as we discover ourselves, our roots are deep and our Chenango Valley family is strong.

## Capital Project Update

Despite everything happening with the COVID-19 pandemic, construction at Chenango Bridge Elementary School has continued. After a slight pause due to the Governor's Executive Order to stop construction activities, it was later clarified that school construction projects could continue under the requirements that proper social distancing and cleaning and disinfection occur. Prior to this Executive Order, construction was actually ahead of schedule, so this delay should not have much of an impact on our timeline. Within the building, walls are painted, a majority of the floors are in, ceilings are installed, and electrical and plumbing systems are close to completion. However, with manufacturing facilities shut down for a period of time, there were delays in getting some of the remaining materials to the site for completion. Although this caused a slight delay to the original planned completion, Chenango Bridge Elementary is on schedule to be completed in time for the anticipated fall occupancy.



## Public Notice

The Chenango Valley Central School District has completed the inspection of all schools and buildings to determine the condition of asbestos that is present, and whether any action is required to avoid potential health hazards for students, employees and visitors. A management plan has been developed in accordance with the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), to ensure the continued provision and maintenance of a safe environment for students, employees and visitors. The management plan includes training of maintenance staff to prevent disturbance of asbestos, periodic re-inspection, surveillance, and limited abatement by trained personnel.

Please note that the comprehensive, triennial inspection occurs once every three years. A surveillance inspection of the asbestos-containing building materials occurs every six months, typically during the months of December and July. Monitoring of these building materials occurs on a continuing basis. A copy of the management plan is available at the district office. 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## Important Message from Our Health Office

There are students in the Chenango Valley School District who have a severe allergy to nuts, peanuts and peanut products. Strict avoidance is the only way to prevent an allergic reaction. The allergy can be life threatening.



In an effort to provide a safe learning environment for these students, we ask that you do not send in any foods which contain nuts, peanuts and/or peanut butter for your student to snack on during the school day. Peanut/nut products may be in your child's lunch, but must be eaten in the cafeteria and not in the classroom, hallway or school bus, including sporting events and field trips. Your cooperation in this matter is greatly appreciated.

## Chenango Valley Community Schools

Chenango Valley is partnering with Binghamton University and its New York State Education Department Central/Western Community Schools Technical Assistance Center (C/W CS-TAC) to become a Community School. As both a place and a set of partnerships, a Community School brings together educators, families and community stakeholders to attain collective impact. Using this statewide strategy, the school acts as a hub (brick and mortar or virtual) to connect and cultivate community assets and then link students and families with them. The Community School strategy aims to expand and enrich learning opportunities, engage families as leaders, improve access to mental health and health services, and strengthen community connections.

A Community School strategy supports our mission to inspire, engage and empower all students to achieve their full potential. Over the past year, Chenango Valley has established a Community Schools Advisory Team. This team consists of school leaders and parent members. It is supported by the Binghamton University Community Schools (BUCS) Regional Network and the Community Schools Technical Assistance Center (CS-TAC). During this school year, we met five times, assessed current practices, administered a family survey in the late fall/early winter, and participated in a site visit from the CS-TAC. The data gathered during this work will drive our goals for next year. The focus of the Chenango Valley Community Schools Team is centered around the idea of connection and collaboration: connection to and with our students, families, community and agencies, as well as collaboration within our school and within our community.

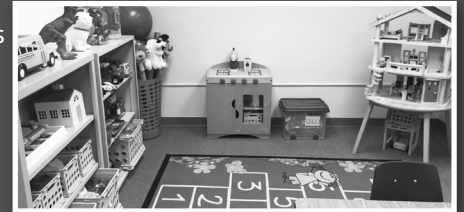
## CV High School Named Among 'Recognition Schools'

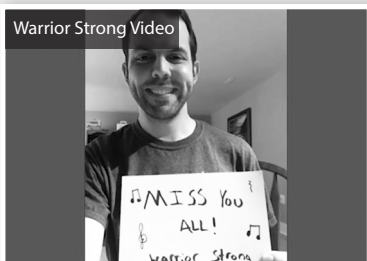
## Primary Project Extends to CB Elementary

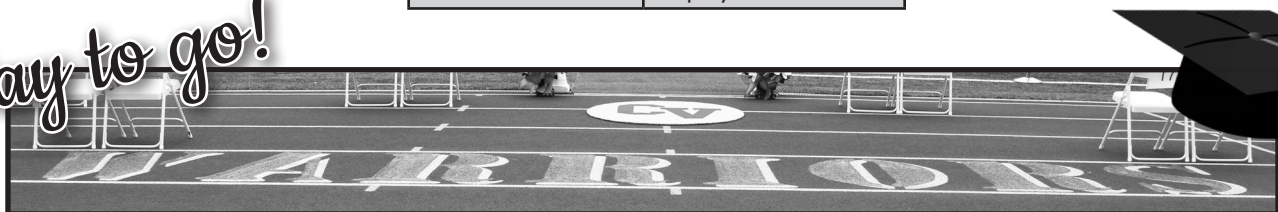

## Congratulations, Chenango Valley Boys Swim!

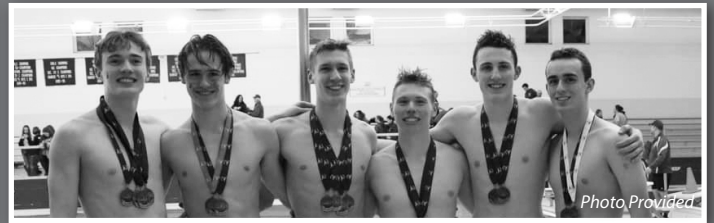

Students had the ability to opt-in to have individual and family photos taken from their homes to be shared in this special keepsake booklet.



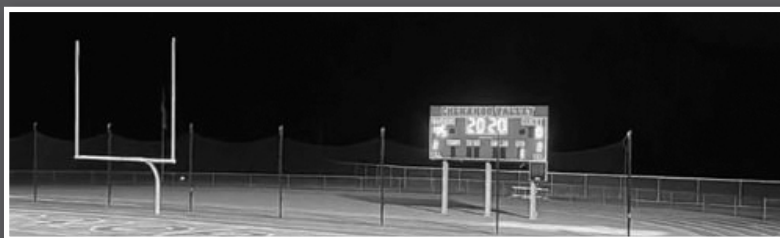

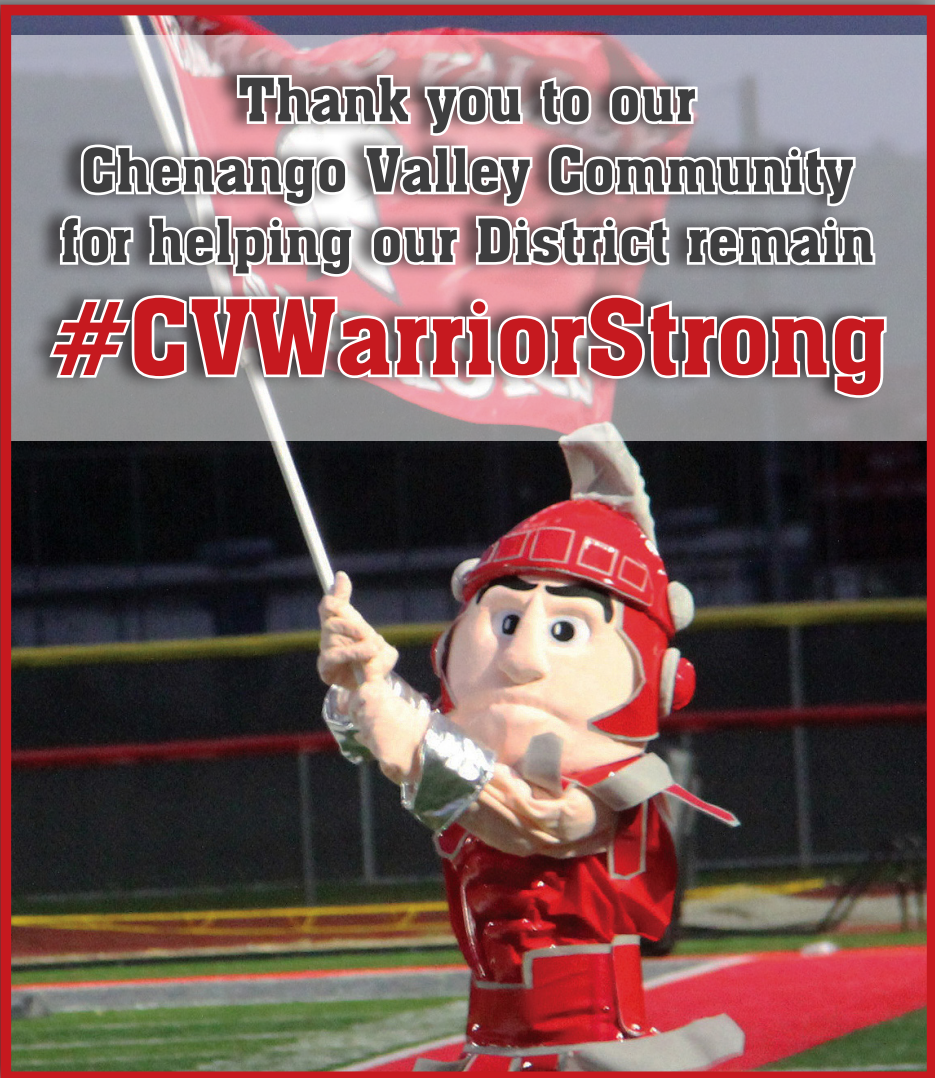
