Dear Chenango Valley Community,

I usually devote my message for our last *Newscaster* of the school year to our seniors. ## Capital Outlay Project

The 2021 capital outlay project work consists of a new canopy at the main entrance of Chenango Bridge Elementary School. The canopy design is reflective of the existing canopy at CV Middle/High School with a multi-sloped red metal roof to pick up the school colors. In addition, a new planter will be added as well as some new building signage, also in a red color. The new canopy will continue the district's goal to improve the exterior aesthetics and function of the building.



## Federal Stimulus Monies

The federal government's stimulus monies for school districts allows for replacement of HVAC equipment to help improve ventilation and filtration in student-occupied buildings. The district is planning on utilizing some of the stimulus funds towards these improvements. Potential scope items include unit ventilator replacement in CV Middle/High School classrooms, and replacement of the make-up air system and cooling tower at Chenango Bridge Elementary School. Utilizing the stimulus funds for these items will allow the district to expand the scope of work for the upcoming proposed capital project.

## Upcoming Capital Project Referendum

A capital project referendum will be presented for public vote in December 2021 for a potential \$20 million project to address top-priority facility improvements. With the use of the district's new 87.8% state aid ratio, this project will maintain the current tax levy to the community, meaning there will not be an increase to the local tax burden. The major focus of the project will be renovations at CV Middle/High School, which hasn't had a major renovation in 20 years. Potential items that are being considered at the middle/high school campus include roof and pavement replacement, installation of lights at the multipurpose field, building system upgrades, classroom upgrades, and renovations of the STEAM room, technology room, art room, and home & careers room.

As the planning process progresses, we will conduct public information sessions and building tours to obtain feedback from community members. ## Public Notice

The Chenango Valley Central School District has completed the inspection of all schools and buildings to determine the condition of asbestos that is present, and whether any action is required to avoid potential health hazards for students, employees, and visitors. A management plan has been developed in accordance with the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), to ensure the continued provision and maintenance of a safe environment for students, employees, and visitors. The management plan includes training of maintenance staff to prevent disturbance of asbestos, periodic re-inspection, surveillance, and limited abatement by trained personnel.

Please note that the comprehensive, triennial inspection occurs once every three years. A surveillance inspection of the asbestos-containing building materials occurs every six months, typically during the months of December and July. Monitoring of these building materials occurs on a continuing basis. A copy of the management plan is available at the district office. # Chenango Valley Celebrates 100 Years of the Port Dickinson School Building!


From June 1-4, Chenango Valley celebrated the Port Dickinson school building being a staple in our community for the past century. While the Chenango Valley Central School District was established in 1950, students and staff have used the learning space on Chenango Street, that is currently home to Port Dickinson Elementary, since 1921. 
## Drama Class Performs Production Written by Students
