Message from the Superintendent


Dear Chenango Valley Community,

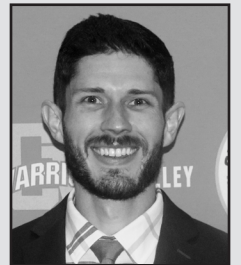

IMPORTANT: Food Services Information for the 2022-23 School Year

We want to share updates for student meals at all school locations. Our goal for the Chenango Valley Central School District is to ensure that all students have access to nutritious breakfast and lunch throughout the school year.

Menus:

The monthly menus will be available through the Chenango Valley CSD website, Rock on Café website, and on the My School Menus app. **Menus are subject to change.*

Meals:

Breakfast:

- Port Dickinson Elementary and Chenango Bridge Elementary students will continue to receive their breakfasts in the classroom.
- Chenango Valley Middle and High School will have a grab-and-go style breakfast.
- Breakfast vending machines are also available at both Chenango Valley Middle School and Chenango Valley High School.
- There will be no charge for breakfast within the Chenango Valley Central School District.

Lunch:

- All Chenango Valley school lunches will be served through the serving line and lunch will be consumed in cafeteria areas.
- Due to the end of government free meal waivers, students will again pay for lunches throughout the district, beginning in fall 2022.
 - Elementary Lunch Price (2022-23): \$2.60 | Secondary Lunch Price (2022-23): \$2.85
- All Chenango Valley families are encouraged to fill out a free-and-reduced meal application yearly.
- Beginning in August, free-and-reduced meal applications for the 2022-23 school year will be made available on the Chenango Valley CSD website, in the district's 2022-23 calendar, at each school's main office, by request at each serving line, or by calling 607-762-6840.

Payment for Meals:

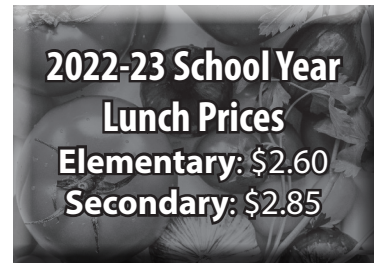
For Chenango Valley students and staff, the following payment methods are accepted:

- Using EZ Meal Pay/My School Bucks located on the Chenango Valley website. (My School Bucks will transition to EZ Meal Pay in September. Any funds put into My School Bucks will transfer to EZ Meal Pay at that time.)
- Checks made out to "Chenango Valley Food Services" will be accepted at the registers for deposit onto student accounts.
- Cash will be accepted at the registers for deposit onto student accounts.
- Students may pay with cash.
- Remaining 2021-22 student funds on My School Bucks accounts will be transferred over to the new EZ Meal Pay system on September 26.

Thank you for supporting our school nutrition program. We are dedicated to serving our students the safest, tastiest, and most nutritious meals possible.

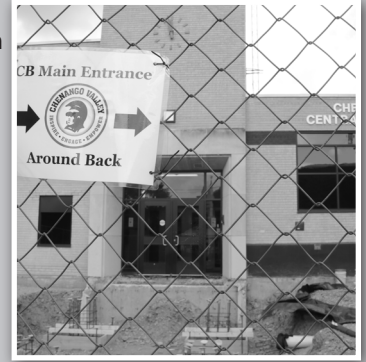

Capital Project Update

Construction work is resuming this summer, with two projects slated to be completed over the summer months. The first project utilizes stimulus monies available through the State to improve HVAC systems in our school buildings. At the CV Middle/High School, the classroom unit ventilators that provide heat, air conditioning, and ventilation are scheduled for replacement in rooms that will not be renovated as part of the larger capital project. At Port Dickinson and Chenango Bridge Elementary Schools, heat pumps that provide heat and air conditioning will be replaced. Additionally, rooftop mechanical equipment at Chenango Bridge that serves the gym and one of the classroom wings will be replaced. Filters for the new equipment will be of a higher standard than the existing and will trap more particulates. Also being replaced at Chenango Bridge is the exterior cooling tower, which works with the HVAC system to provide cooling.

The second project consists of a new entrance canopy at Chenango Bridge. The canopy will provide more protection from the weather and give the building entrance more of an identity. It will be constructed in a similar design to the canopies at the CV Middle/High School. The project will also contain new signage on the front of the building and a planter to further enhance the aesthetics of the building.

Public Notice

The Chenango Valley Central School District has completed the inspection of all schools and buildings to determine the condition of asbestos that is present, and whether any action is required to avoid potential health hazards for students, employees, and visitors. A management plan has been developed in accordance with the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), to ensure the continued provision and maintenance of a safe environment for students, employees, and visitors. The management plan includes training of maintenance staff to prevent disturbance of asbestos, periodic re-inspection, and surveillance.

Please note that the comprehensive, triennial inspection occurs once every three years. A surveillance inspection of the asbestos containing building materials occurs every six months, typically during the months of December and July. Monitoring of these building materials occurs on a continuing basis. A copy of the management plan is available at the district office. Important Message from Our Health Office Regarding Nut Allergies

There are students in the Chenango Valley School District who have a severe allergy to nuts, peanuts, and peanut products. Strict avoidance is the only way to prevent an allergic reaction. The allergy can be life-threatening.

In an effort to provide a safe learning environment for these students, we ask that you do not send in any foods which contain nuts, peanuts and/or peanut butter for your student to snack on during the school day. Peanut/nut products may be in your child's lunch, but must be eaten in the cafeteria and not in the classroom, hallway or school bus, including sporting events and field trips. Your cooperation is appreciated.

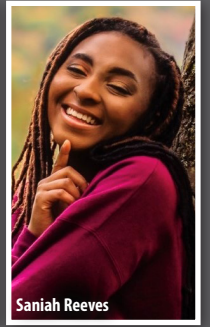
CV Seniors Earn NYS Seal of Biliteracy
