Emergency Alert System

The district uses an automated system to quickly send messages to parents/guardians in the event of a school or district emergency. Messages will be sent in the form of an email and/or text to your cell phone. To receive messages, you will need to have an account on our district website:

- 1. Go to www.cvcsd.stier.org
- 2. Select "Public Login" at the top right-hand corner of the page (black bar).
- 3. Log in and/or create a new account.
- 4. Select the notification preferences you would like to receive: Emergency Alerts, Athletics, etc. Choose one or more schools from the list to receive notifications pertaining just to that school. To receive notifications for district-wide emergencies, which include weather-related school closings, select "Emergency Alerts/Closing and Delay".

Important Message Regarding Nut Allergies

Capital Project Update

It has been another busy summer construction season throughout the district as we continue to make sure all of our facilities are in good working order. Construction work completed over the summer includes the following:

- · Bus loop and sidewalk replacement at Port Dickinson
- Parking lot replacement at Chenango Bridge
- Rear drive replacement at CV Middle School/High School
- Roof replacement at Port Dickinson
- · Softball/multi-purpose field parking lot pavement
- Stadium lighting
- · Masonry restoration at all buildings

There is still some minor work to be finished, but the majority is now complete.



The Chenango Bridge west parking lot asphalt has been removed and new asphalt binder is down. The asphalt top has since been installed and the parking lot is complete.



At Chenango Bridge, porcelain panels above the windows at the rear of the building have been removed and a new thin brick system will be installed soon.



Asphalt at the Port Dickinson play area has been removed and new asphalt has been installed.



The Port Dickinson roof shingles have been replaced.



A new concrete walk along the PDE bus loop is complete. Asphalt at the bus loop was removed and new asphalt binder was installed. The asphalt top has been installed and the bus loop is complete.

CV Summer STEAM Program Provides Education, Inspiration

This year's CV Summer STEAM Program focused on the theme of "nature"! To extend this exciting educational opportunity to even more students, the program was held in two separate two-week sessions this year. During these sessions, students entering grades 1 - 6 were able to take part in a variety of informative, fun and interactive activities! The grade 1-2 groups participated in experiments including bubble blowing, tornado in a jar, and handmade mini parachutes to help them learn about wind; making baking soda volcanoes; and testing the symmetry of different items found in nature -- just to name a few projects! Student participants in grades 3-4 took part in activities including seed dispersal challenges, "Animal Riddle Relays" with the grade 5-6 group, and WBNG's Storm Track 12 Meteorologist Mr. Brian Schroeder was even able to stop by and talk with a session of students about weather-related topics! The grade 5-6 groups became "Animal Avengers" during this program. Using a 3D printer, students created prosthetic parts to help an animal character of their choice. They also researched information on their animal and worked in teams to write a story about how the prosthetic part helped their chosen character.

We're so excited to be able to offer this educational experience and engage our CV student learners, even during the summertime!

















BOCES Summer STEAM Academy Expands Skills and Knowledge

Chenango Valley Middle School and High School students were among students from around the area who had a great time taking part in the BOCES Summer STEAM Academy! During the first week of the two-week program, middle school participants worked on exciting robotics activities at the BOCES campus including programming for an obstacle course, Indie 500 programming, and other exciting challenges to test their skills and knowledge! At SUNY Broome, high school students took part in activities including developing designs for a cardboard boat race held in the Chenango Valley High School pool, and a carnival event that students themselves created the games for (including mini golf and puppets)! In the second week, the groups switched campuses and the middle school students engaged in activities at SUNY Broome, while the high school students tested their skills at the BOCES campus.







Warrior Academy 2018 Produces Physical and Mental Growth

Chenango Valley's 2018 Warrior Academy began on July 9. This summer, more than 100 students entering grades 6-12 took part in the free strength and conditioning program. With the help of an integrated UHS Athletic Trainer and UHS Human Performance Trainer, students focused on strength, conditioning, flexibility and agility training for all sports. Three different sessions were held daily, Monday through Thursday, up until August 9. During their time in the program, students also participated in "Theme Weeks" to focus on specific topics in athletic training -- such as mindset and leadership skills. CVCSD Hosts Safety Training Exercises

In an ongoing and continuous effort to keep the safety of our schools a top priority, Chenango Valley Central School District worked with public safety officials and additional community partners on safety training exercises on July 13.

In collaboration with members of Broome-Endicott SWAT, the morning began with an active shooter training drill held in Chenango Valley High School. The drill included staff and student volunteers. Observers included representatives from Chenango Valley administration and public safety officials.

Following the active shooter drill training, a tabletop exercise was held in the Chenango Valley Middle School/High School library. The exercise was facilitated by Michael Ponticiello, Director of Broome County Emergency Services, and Michelle Feyerabend, Chenango Valley Central School District Assistant Superintendent. Discussion included a review of the active shooter drill, plans that worked, and what can be improved. It also included further discussion on topics such as evacuation procedures, parent and child reunification, public information, and psychosocial impacts.

Agencies that participated in the tabletop exercise included representatives from Broome County Emergency Services, Broome-Endicott SWAT, the Broome County Sheriff's Office, EMS, the Red Cross, the Broome County Office, Broome County Mental Health, NYS DHSES Office of Emergency Management, and the Broome County Promise Zone. Chenango Valley administrators, staff, SROs, and safety team representatives also took part in the conversation.



The goal of this training was to focus on a review of existing response plans and the functions of each agency during public safety incidents. The collaboration between school personnel and public safety officials is part of ongoing work to help ensure a unified response in the event of a potential incident. The intent is to continue this type of drill and tabletop exercise with external parties annually in the future. Throughout the school year internal tabletop exercises are also held with school resource officers and internal safety teams.

Chenango Valley is grateful for this collaboration with community partners to help in the continuous efforts to keep our schools and community safe.

Mental Health First Aid Training Held at CV

Chenango Valley Central School District staff members took part in a Mental Health First Aid training led by CV Social Workers Ms. Arnold and Mrs. Hubenthal on July 19.

The program teaches individuals ways to help someone in a crisis or experiencing a mental health challenge. Workshops were also held during the 2017-18 school year. Additional workshops will continue to be held throughout the 2018-19 school year and next summer, with the goal of having 100 percent of Chenango Valley staff members trained on Mental Health First Aid.



Professional Development Provides Staff Exciting Learning Opportunities

Various CV staff professional development training programs took place this summer -- including workshops such as A.P.L. Associates, Les Loomis, OPALS training, and more. Our Chenango Valley teachers and staff love to learn new things and grow in their fields! Thank you to those who helped to teach this important information to our staff members!


Students Attend Research Workshop at Binghamton University

Chenango Valley High School students built upon their scientific skills as they took part in a workshop through the Freshman Research Immersion program at Binghamton University. Elizabeth Morgan, Grace Elliott, and Dominick Lomonaco attended a "Geospatial Remote Sensing Multispectral Workshop" with Mrs. Ginalski on July 7.

The workshop included a visit to Binghamton University's Nuthatch Hollow site, and discussion on topics including tree/plant health, water quality, and multispectral imaging. Data was also collected with a drone and hand-held spectrometer. This data was processed and students learned about data interpretation, and analyzed and discussed results. The day also included a poster session, debriefing, and post-learning assessment.

Title I, Parents' Right-to-Know Notification Letter Required by No Child Left Behind Legislation

To Port Dickinson, Chenango Bridge and Chenango Valley Middle School Parents/Guardians,

Upon request parents of students attending Title I schools – Port Dickinson, Chenango Bridge and Chenango Valley Middle School - may request information regarding the professional qualifications of your child's teachers, and paraprofessional staff.

Please call the Board Office at 762-6810 should you want information regarding:

A. whether the teacher has met State qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction;

- B. whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which State qualification or licensing criteria have been waived;
- C. the baccalaureate degree major of the teacher and any other graduate certification or degree held by the teacher, and the field of discipline of the certification or degree; and
- D. whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.

Then too, should Chenango Valley's Title I schools – Port Dickinson, Chenango Bridge and/or Chenango Valley Middle School be identified for school improvement, corrective action and/or restructuring, letters would be sent to parents which would include:

- A. An explanation of what the identification means and how the school compares to other schools in terms of achievement.
- B. The reason(s) for identification
- C. How the problem is being addressed
- D. How parents can help
- E. The option to transfer to another public school

This letter is to satisfy the NCLB (No Child Left Behind) parent notification requirements should Port Dickinson, Chenango Bridge or Chenango Valley Middle; School be identified as a Title I School in Need of Improvement, or Title I Corrective Action.

Public Notice Regarding Asbestos

The Chenango Valley Central School District completes inspection of all schools and buildings to determine the condition of asbestos that is present, and whether any action is required to avoid potential health hazards for students, employees and visitors.

A management plan has been developed in accordance with the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), to ensure the continued provision and maintenance of a safe environment for students, employees and visitors. The management plan includes training of maintenance staff to prevent disturbance of asbestos, periodic re-inspection, surveillance, and limited abatement by trained personnel.

Please note that the comprehensive, triennial inspection occurs once every three years. A surveillance inspection of the asbestos containing building materials occurs every six months, typically during the months of December and July. Monitoring of these building materials occurs on a continuing basis.

Chenango Valley Central School District Request for Pesticide Application Notification

New York State Education Law Section 409-H and State Education Department Commissioner's Regulation 155.24, effective July 1, 2001, requires all public and nonpublic elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the school year.

Chenango Valley Central School District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior notification of certain pesticide applications.

If you would like to receive such notification or would like further information regarding this matter, please contact Mr. George Zlock, Director of School Facilities and Operations at (607) 762-6861.


Students Share Helpful Advice for Incoming MS/HS Students




We hope that these words of kindness helped to inspire the younger students, and that all students keep these positive thoughts in mind as they venture through the school year.
