In addition, phone calls to primary contacts and opt-in text alerts (see below for more information) may be used to notify families that updates have been sent. If you are a parent/guardian and have had any issues receiving updates/alert notifications, please reach out to our Director of Curriculum/ Technology Mrs. Sarah Latimer by emailing SLatimer@cvcsd.stier.org or calling (607) 762-6820 to make sure your information is updated in our system. Please include your name (first and last), any updated information (i.e. phone number and/or email address), along with the name(s) of your child(ren) (first and last).

# **Opt-In for Alert Notifications**

In addition to the updates sent through our student management system, the district also provides an opt-in alert system that allows parents/guardians and community members to receive notifications regarding items such as district announcements and emergency/ weather-related closing alerts. These alert notifications will be sent in the form of an email and/or text to your cell phone. To receive these alert notifications, you will need to sign up for an account through our district website:

#### 1. Go to www.cvcsd.stier.org

2. Select "PUBLIC LOGIN" at the top right-hand corner of the district homepage if on desktop computer or go to "Register to Receive School Closings/Alert Messages" if on desktop/mobile devices.

3. Log in or create a new account. 4. Select the notification preferences you would like to receive. To receive districtwide notifications such as emergencies and weather-related school closings, select "Emergency Alerts/Closing and Delay".

We encourage you to check and make sure you're signed up. If your contact information has changed, please update your contact information in the system as needed to ensure you receive alert notifications. # Daily Health Screenings and Bi-Monthly FamilyID Student Health Screening Questionnaire

It is vital that parents/guardians complete a daily health screening and temperature check for each child attending school in person before they leave home. In addition, families are required to submit bi-monthly health screening questionnaires via FamilyID.

#### **Daily Health Screening**

• Parents/guardians must complete a daily health screening and temperature check of their child(ren) prior to having them report to in-person instruction. While these won't be submitted on a daily basis, it is extremely important to complete the screening each day with fidelity. More information can be found on our district website (www.cvcsd.stier.org).

#### **Bi-Monthly FamilyID Student Health Screening Questionnaire**

• The bi-monthly online health screening questionnaire via FamilyID serves as a confirmation that parents/guardians are completing the daily at-home health screening of their child(ren) attending in-person instruction with fidelity.

• Within five (5) days of the 1st and 15th of EVERY month, parents/guardians must complete and submit the online health screening questionnaire for each of their children attending in-person instruction. Parents/guardians will receive an email link from the district each time prompting them to submit the questionnaire. There will be a new link sent before the 1st and 15th of each month. Each up-to-date link will also be available on our district website homepage.

#### Student Photography Opt-Out

There are times when our district may be featured in various media. We will make every effort to honor your request; however, please be aware that there may be circumstances when your child may be photographed or filmed beyond our control. We suggest discussing your wishes with your child so that they know your preference for noninclusion in photos/video.

#### Important Message Regarding Nut Allergies

There are students in the CV schools who have a severe allergy to nuts, peanuts and peanut products. The allergy can be life-threatening, and strict avoidance is the only way to prevent an allergic reaction.

# **Capital Project Update**

Phase 2 of the capital improvements project is nearly complete. Construction at Chenango Bridge Elementary wrapped up over the summer with only some minor items that need final completion. Students were able to experience an exciting transformation to the building on their first day of school!

Several improvements occurred at our bus garage over the summer as well. Work included expansion of the bus storage bays to better fit buses, door and window replacement, new handicap accessible restrooms, renovated drivers' lounge and offices, HVAC improvements, and electrical improvements. Final completion will occur within the next couple of weeks.

Since the start of the most recent capital project, the district has seen significant improvements to its facilities, which have helped to reduce maintenance needs, save energy, and provide better educational spaces for our students and staff.



# Title I, Parents' Right to Know Notification Letter

To Port Dickinson, Chenango Bridge and Chenango Valley Middle School Parents/Guardians,

In accordance with the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA), parents of students attending Title I schools – Port Dickinson, Chenango Bridge and Chenango Valley Middle School - may request information regarding the professional qualifications of your child's teachers and paraprofessional staff.

Please call the District Office at 762-6810 should you want information regarding:

A. whether the teacher has met State qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction;

B. whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which State qualification or licensing criteria have been waived;

C. the baccalaureate degree major of the teacher and any other graduate certification or degree held by the teacher, and the field of discipline of the certification or degree; and

D. whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.

#### **Public Notice Regarding Asbestos**

The Chenango Valley Central School District completes inspection of all schools and buildings to determine the condition of asbestos that is present, and whether any action is required to avoid potential health hazards for students, employees and visitors.

A management plan has been developed in accordance with the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), to ensure the continued provision and maintenance of a safe environment for students, employees and visitors. The management plan includes training of maintenance staff to prevent disturbance of asbestos, periodic re-inspection, surveillance and limited abatement by trained personnel.

Please note that the comprehensive, triennial inspection occurs once every three years. A surveillance inspection of the asbestos containing building materials occurs every six months, typically during the months of December and July. Monitoring of these building materials occurs on a continuing basis.

#### Chenango Valley Central School District Request for Pesticide Application Notification

New York State Education Law Section 409-H and State Education Department Commissioner's Regulation 155.24, effective July 1, 2001, requires all public and nonpublic elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation, faculty and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the school year.

Chenango Valley Central School District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation, faculty and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior notification of certain pesticide applications.


