CV RECOGNIZES BOARD OF EDUCATION



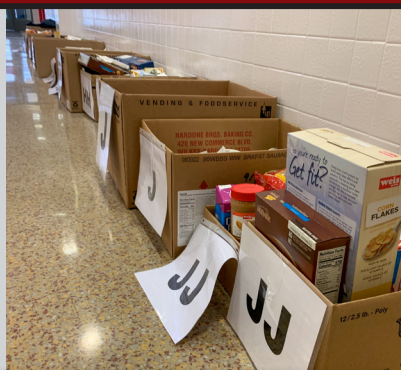

Message from the Superintendent


Dear Chenango Valley Community,

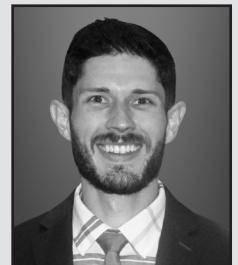
Along with all of this daily learning, there are so many highlights to share from Port Dickinson:

- Kindergarten students took a field trip to a pumpkin farm in October, and they each came home with their own pumpkin.
- Our PTA Book Fair provided students reading materials to continue their growth at home.
- Our annual Halloween Parade was a success, with our Little Warriors showing off their costumes and parading for their families. It was so nice to see family members lining the sidewalks of the building to cheer on the students.
- We were excited to invite families to Humanities Night on November 17. Teachers, community members, and local organizations hosted activity tables for students to make crafts and celebrate the humanities.
- Our weekly Positivity Project (P2) assembly takes place on Monday mornings. Our staff engage students in dialogue, stories, and scenarios that support the P2 character trait of the week. During the rest of the week, faculty and staff reinforce the trait through discussions in the classroom and individual conversations with students.
- We have had Ag in the Classroom programs coming into the school, where educators from Cornell Cooperative Extension connect students to the agricultural learning available in our area.
- Our parent-teacher conferences have started. It has been so nice to see families in our school and building partnerships with our teachers.

I love to see all students here at the school every day. Regular school attendance is a critical factor in seeing students consistently grow in their learning and understanding. Family partnerships are vital to student success, and I can't thank you enough for the support that you provide in enhancing the learning happening at school. Together we can do so much.

Chenango Bridge Elementary (Grades: 3-5)

I hope you've had a fantastic fall! Chenango Bridge has fully "hit the ground running" and established strong foundations for student success throughout the 2022-23 school year. - **A Focus on Learning** - *Chenango Bridge is focused on each individual student and their continuous growth toward their learning goals. It is critical that we support one another to progress "one step at a time" toward every goal!*

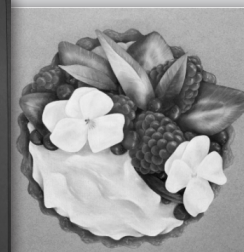

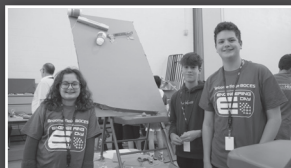
CV Middle School and High School Teams Participate in BOCES Engineering Day

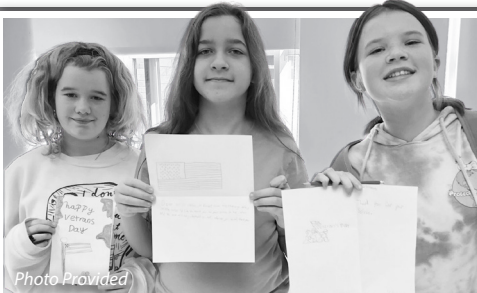

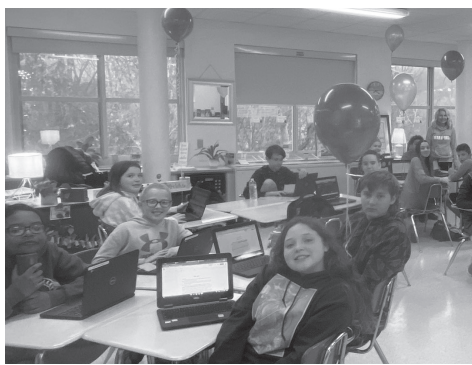

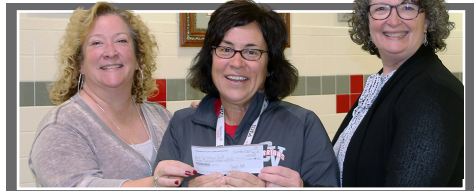


CV Alumni Receive Recognition and Inspire Future Graduates
