Note: Pre-K students enrolled at PD Elementary for the 2024-25 school year will automatically be registered for kindergarten in the 2025-26 school year.





Reminder: Winter Weather Notifications and Procedures

With the winter weather season upon us, we want to remind families of the procedures for school closings, delays, and early dismissals to ensure the safety of our students, staff, and community.

- Notifications for closings, delays, or early dismissals will be shared through local news outlets, our voice call system (to students' primary contacts), the district website, the CV mobile app, and our opt-in emergency alert system.
- Please ensure your contact information is up to date in our opt-in alert system to receive emergency notifications.

Key Definitions to Note:

- **School Closing:** No school or extracurricular activities will take place.
- **One- or Two-Hour Delay:** School begins later; dismissal times remain the same. (Two-hour delay = no AM pre-K)
- **Three-Hour Delay:** Would only be used in specific cases of forecasted improvement; dismissal times stay the same. (No AM pre-K)
- **Early Dismissal:** Students may be released early due to potentially dangerous weather.

We appreciate your partnership in keeping our school community safe during the winter months!

Commitment to School Safety

The safety and well-being of our students and staff remain a top priority. As a routine reminder, here are key safety protocols and measures in place to ensure our schools remain secure:

- **Response and Communication:** The district acts quickly in situations to provide timely updates to keep staff and families informed. Please ensure your contact information is up to date in our system to receive these communications. Need help updating your details? Contact Mrs. Latimer using the information above.
- **Collaboration with Law Enforcement:** We partner closely with local law enforcement to handle situations. Families will be notified promptly about changes to school schedules or procedures as needed.
- **Daily Safety Measures:** Schools are secured daily with controlled entry, secure vestibules, visitor ID checks, and on-site school resource officers.
- **Supporting Students:** School counselors and social work staff are available to provide support and resources for students.
- **Preparedness Drills:** Routine evacuation, lockdown, and bus safety drills are conducted to help students and staff prepare in the event of an emergency. This year, we notify families in advance of drills taking place.

We are committed to creating a safe, supportive environment for all. Thank you for your partnership in keeping our schools secure.

Dear Chenango Valley School Community,

We hope that you and your families are enjoying this festive season as we've transitioned from fall to winter. With the "new car smell" of the school year behind us, we've taken the opportunity to reflect on our progress through the first quarter and analyze our achievements as the year draws to a close.

One area we are particularly proud of is attendance. Thanks to the incredible support of our CV families, our October average daily attendance hit a five-year high of 94.7% across all buildings! It's worth noting that missing just two days per month puts a student on track to be chronically absent, so your efforts to ensure consistent attendance are making a real difference—thank you!

We had much to celebrate in our fall athletics! Our varsity girls soccer team earned its fourth consecutive Section IV title, while our varsity cheer team went undefeated in meets and placed third in STAC. The varsity volleyball team reached sectionals for the first time since 2018, and our football team showed significant progress compared to recent years. In addition, our swimming and cross country teams had athletes qualify for the championships. Athletes signed their national letters of intent to continue their athletic careers in college, and CV students were recognized as "Athletes of the Week" by various news outlets. Our district also hosted sectional and regional championships, showcasing the exceptional quality of our facilities.

The CV Middle School Drama Club worked hard to bring Disney/Pixar's *Finding Nemo JR.* to life on stage in the auditorium, showcasing their talent and dedication. Their efforts and enthusiasm made for unforgettable performances!

Capital Project Update: Port Dickinson Elementary Outdoor Learning Center Progress

We're excited to share that construction of the PD Elementary School Outdoor Learning Center (OLC) is now complete!

- The project began in summer 2023 with the construction of a dock and walking path around the stormwater pond behind the school. By this past summer, the old pavilion was removed to make room for a brand-new enclosed building.
- The new OLC is a customized version of the CV Middle/High School OLC, featuring a class-sized indoor instructional area. A large overhead door opens to an outdoor activity space, offering easy access to the pond and outdoor learning opportunities.
- Inside, the OLC will have new furniture, storage cabinets, and two greenhouse windows designed for hands-on projects.

This exciting addition to the PD Elementary campus will offer students innovative, engaging ways to explore the world around them. We can't wait for them to start using this space in the spring!

ALL FALL 2024 TEAMS EARN SCHOLAR-ATHLETE HONORS!




Colsten Beers advanced to the NYS Girls Swim Championships in the 100 butterfly!
