
Chenango Valley continues to work on addressing the challenges brought on by the bus driver shortage. As previously addressed, we understand the hardships that can be caused by delays in transportation pick-ups and drop-offs when there are driver absences. We commend the dedication and commitment of our transportation department. They work hard to transport students safely to and from school each day, with drivers at times needing to adjust to multiple routes in order to make this possible. I recognize that these changes cause frustration and disruption to our families. We are working hard to make adjustments to ensure that we are able to sustain in-person learning each day and avoid having to go to fully-remote instruction. We will continue to keep our Warrior community updated as we work to find long-term solutions to this challenge that is impacting the nation. Principal Messages

Port Dickinson Elementary (Grades: Pre-K - 2)

We are in the time of the year where we have sunshine on one day and then cold temperatures and snow the next day. Inside our classrooms at Port Dickinson Elementary, our students are enthusiastic to learn new concepts, skills, and strategies to become terrific readers, writers, mathematicians, and scientists. Port Dickinson Elementary is a great place to learn and grow.

Academically, we are continuing to develop our readers and writers through our Reading and Writing Workshop Model. We call our kids "readers" and "writers" because they have so many opportunities to share, read, and write about our world, their lives, and stories they read. We are also focusing on phonics and teaching our students how to use letters and sounds to build words. As mathematicians, our students demonstrate their thinking and use of strategies through "Math Talks." Our goal is to instill confidence and an "I can do it" attitude for our students. Learning is a process that takes time, effort, and a positive, energetic attitude.

In our school, we are very lucky to have collaborative teachers (special education and AIS), therapists (OT, PT, and speech/language), and special areas (art, library, music, and physical education). These talented professionals assist students to learn in a variety of ways. Through the work of our social worker and school counselor, we are providing exceptional support in the area of social-emotional learning. We are also so fortunate to have a fabulous group of school-related professionals working tirelessly with our kids to support their learning. Our school wouldn't be complete without all of our terrific clerical staff, food services staff, custodians/cleaners, and our awesome School Resource Officer (SRO), Mr. Sine.

Throughout the year we have developed a wonderful relationship with a nursing home in our community. We love sending cards and pictures to brighten their days. We are so grateful for our dedicated CV Elementary PTA. This enthusiastic team provides excellent support and exciting activities for our kids and families. On January 13, we were very lucky to have a virtual author visit with Mr. Peter Reynolds. Mr. Reynolds shared fantastic stories and answered student questions. Reading and writing is so valuable to our "CV Little Warriors."

Please see the strategies that were shared in the fall that we can all use to advance our students beyond expectations:

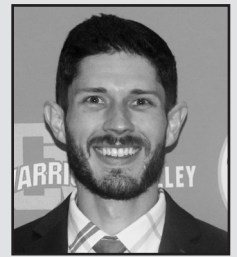
- Read books every day that are at our reader's level and "stretch" their skills to enhance growth.
- Have regular mathematical conversations with students (*ex: How did you get the answer?*) in both real life and schoolwork.
- Practice positive responses to difficult situations such as disagreements, frustration, anger, etc.
- Sing, dance, play a sport, practice an instrument, investigate a mystery, and research an author.

Although we don't have tenth period busing right now, we still have tenth period remediation for any student who is able to stay after. This is a great way to get extra help from a teacher. In addition to tenth period, we also have 3-5:30 p.m. remediation time. We have 3-5:30 school every Monday-Thursday (when school is in session) and any student is welcome to attend. We have a special education teacher and a content area teacher each day who are available to help students catch up on work, review for assessments, or review concepts taught in class. If you would like your child to attend our 3-5:30 school, feel free to reach out to our guidance department.

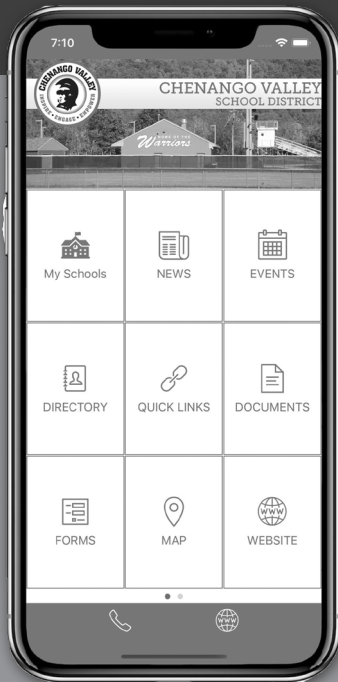

Information for Parents/Guardians: Course Scheduling 2022-23

It is the time of year when the high school counselors are working with our children to get them ready for the 2022-23 school year. We have started meeting with our students one-on-one to complete individual planning sheets. One common theme covered in planning is talking about available course options. We encourage our students to take challenging courses and try to be thoughtful about how their choices will benefit them in the college selection process and in life.

The scheduling process includes going into English classes in the spring, where a presentation and overview of options are covered. Students will all have a copy of their planning sheet and will add their classes online via their Chromebook. We will provide parents/guardians with a copy of the courses their children selected by including them with a five-week report or quarter report card in May.

If you have a question about the courses your child selected, please feel free to call our office at (607) 762-6918. We thank you for your support and look forward to hearing from you.

Attention Student-Athletes

As you know, the NCAA has established eligibility rules related to participating in Division I and II college athletics. Should you be considering athletics in college, it is absolutely imperative that you notify your school counselor now. Students are required to take 16 core subject courses. The NCAA does not use elective courses to complete the 16.

To participate at the Division I or II level, you must also register with the NCAA Clearinghouse by going to www.eligibilitycenter.org. Once you have registered, it will prompt you to let the guidance office know so we can submit a transcript. Finally, you must submit your SAT or ACT scores to the NCAA Eligibility Center directly from the testing agency in order to certify the student-athlete's initial eligibility. All test scores are required to be sent.

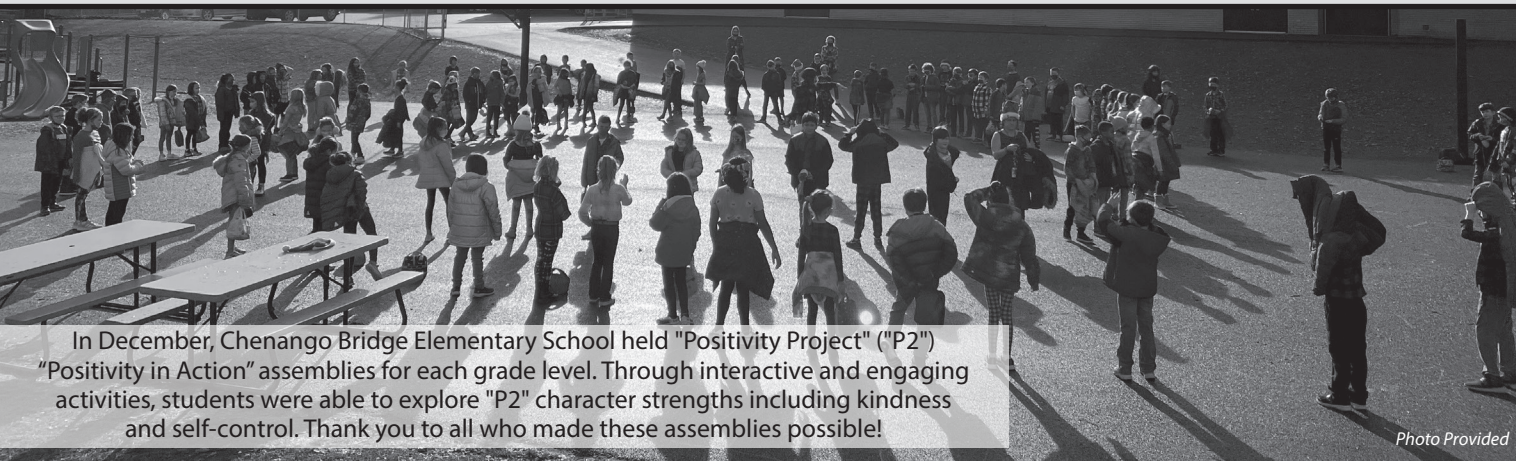

Capital Project Update

Thank you to our community members for supporting the Chenango Valley Central School District by approving the proposed \$19.5 million capital project through a public vote in December. Detailed design of the project has already begun. One of the first steps that occurs in the design process is to gather feedback from stakeholders regarding aspects of the project that will have an impact on them. We have held these stakeholder meetings with our architect for CV Middle School/High School areas including art, FACS, technology, and STEAM as well as the auditorium, fitness room, and sitework. The architect will use this information, along with the data they have gathered from evaluating the existing spaces, to lay out detailed plans of what the updated spaces will look like and share with the stakeholders.

Other scope items for the project are being investigated in detail by the architect so preliminary designs can be prepared. In addition, a site survey and geotechnical investigation will occur at the CV Middle School/High School campus over the next month to allow for accurate site designs to be prepared. The goal is to complete preliminary designs over the next few months so the district can approve the final scope of the project. Once complete, detailed construction documents will then be prepared and submitted to the New York State Education Department for approval.

Port Dickinson Elementary pre-K classes enjoyed a fun Family Day on December 22! Students and family members made delightful gingerbread creations.



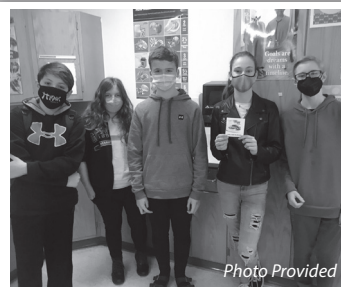
After reading "Balloons Over Broadway," third grade students created puppets and put on their own parade in the halls of Chenango Bridge Elementary! Awesome job, Warriors!
