

Information for Parents/Caregivers: Course Scheduling 2023-24

It is the time of year when the high school counselors are working with your children to get them ready for the 2023-24 school year. We have started meeting with our students one-on-one to complete individual planning sheets. One common theme covered in planning is talking about available course options. We encourage our students to take challenging courses and try to be thoughtful about how their choices will benefit them in the college selection process and in life.

The scheduling process includes going into English classes in the spring, where a presentation and overview of options are covered. Students will all have a copy of their planning sheet and will add their classes online via their Chromebook. We will provide parents/caregivers with a copy of the courses their children selected by including them with a five-week report or quarter report card in May.

Attention Student-Athletes

As you know, the NCAA has established eligibility rules related to participating in Division I and II college athletics. Should you be considering athletics in college, it is absolutely imperative that you notify your school counselor now. Students are required to take 16 core subject courses. The NCAA does not use elective courses to complete the 16.

To participate at the Division I or II level, you must also register with the NCAA Clearinghouse by going to www.eligibilitycenter.org. Once you have registered, it will prompt you to let the guidance office know so we can submit a transcript. Finally, you must submit your SAT or ACT scores to the NCAA Eligibility Center directly from the testing agency in order to certify the student-athlete's initial eligibility. All test scores are required to be sent.

Please see your counselor for more details on eligibility rules.

Capital Project Update

Our \$19.5 million capital improvements project approved in December 2021 is continuing to progress. The design is complete and has been reviewed and approved by the NY State Education Department. We have proceeded to the procurement phase and are receiving proposals in various forms from interested contractors. We hope to award the contracts at our March board of education meeting, so the selected contractors can start ordering construction materials. Because of the size of this project, it will be completed over a two year period with the majority of the work occurring over the summer months. At this point in time, we are anticipating a large amount of site work and roofing work at the CV Middle School/High School to occur over the summer of 2023. Other miscellaneous work inside all of our buildings will take place at the same time. In the summer of 2024, we anticipate some major renovations inside the middle school/high school to occur.

In addition, our HVAC project will be finishing up this coming summer. Unit ventilators will be replaced throughout the middle school/high school and some additional HVAC equipment will be replaced at the elementary schools. This project was funded through federal stimulus monies and will improve air distribution and filtration in our schools.

Our yearly capital outlay project is nearly complete. The rooftop HVAC unit that serves the middle school/high school has been replaced and will greatly improve the ventilation within the space.
