Mariah plans to attend SUNY Broome and major in psychology.




Class Rank: 6 - Hollis Krisko

This is our special graduation edition of the district newsletter!



Pre-K & kindergarten registration


If you have a child who will be four or five years old by December 1, 2017, please call the appropriate number below to be placed on a mailing list to receive registration information for pre-K or kindergarten.

Capital Project updates

Capital improvement construction will continue at all district facilities this summer. Construction will conclude the \$12.4 million project approved by district voters in 2014. Through this project, the district has been able to make numerous improvements including the addition of multiple athletic fields, new playgrounds, roof replacements, and parking lot reconstruction.

This summer, construction at Chenango Bridge Elementary School will include renovations to the multipurpose room and kitchen, a secure vestibule, fire alarm and PA systems replacement, and installation of a new camera system. At Port Dickinson Elementary School, renovations will occur in the kitchen and cafetorium, the HVAC system will be improved, the fire alarm and PA systems will be replaced, and a new security office, secure vestibule, and camera system will be installed. Finally, construction at our Middle School/ High School will include pool lighting and HVAC systems replacement.

Although we have completed a lot of work throughout the district over the past few years, there are still needs within the buildings. Therefore, we are moving forward with a plan to continually maintain our facilities, and are evaluating a potential Capital Project that would be presented for public vote in December 2017. A community meeting was held on June 19 to discuss the potential project, which would address some remaining top priority capital improvements at our facilities. Improvements under consideration for this project include:

Elementary Schools

- Classroom finishes, casework, and furniture replacement
- Creation of STEAM classroom
- Classroom LED lighting replacement
- Window replacement
- Mechanical system replacement
- Gymnasium renovation
- Exterior site reconstruction

Middle / High School

- New stadium lights
- Sustainable greenhouse/ classroom space (adjacent to the pond)
- Library renovation
- Gymnasium renovation
- Pool locker replacement
- Exterior door replacement
- Classroom LED lighting replacement

(Elementary schools classroom refurbishment)



The potential \$15 million Capital Project continues to support one of the goals of CV's Board of Education to control tax levy growth for our community, and was designed to maintain a consistent tax effort for CV taxpayers.

Second grade students participated in the 2017 Egg Drop, testing their protective egg designs from three different heights. Fourth grade finished up their biomimicry commercials. After creating unique prototypes of an invention to solve a problem using nature as inspiration, students created sales pitches and commercials to "sell" their products.

Some of our CV Middle School students participated in the Mars Rover Challenge featured on page five. All of the teams were enthusiastic, and impressed our partners from Triple Cities Makerspace.

Many of our students, at all levels, are participating in various STEAM camps this summer to continue problem-solving and creating. One of our students, senior John Cemay, is off to a unique experience. He received a paid internship at a major engineering company, due largely to pre-engineering classes that he completed here at CV. He was part of our first group to complete the Fast Forward Engineering Class and is on to great things.

Honorary diploma recognizes deceased Vietnam veteran

Former Chenango Valley High School student and Vietnam casualty Roger L. Jones, who was never able to receive his high school diploma, was honored at a CV Board of Education meeting in May.

Jones attended CVHS until 1967, when he joined the U.S. Marines. As a Lance Corporal, he was assigned in Vietnam to the First Engineer Battalion, First Marine Division and was killed in an explosion as he slept in his barracks in Da Nang, Vietnam, on November 4, 1969.

Family members of Jones accepted the honorary diploma to recognize his time as a CV student.

Mental health first aid training

CV social workers Jackie Arnold and Beth Hubenthal recently became certified in mental health first aid training after completing a specialized three-day course.

Mental Health First Aid USA is a public education program that teaches individuals how to help someone who is in a crisis or experiencing a mental health challenge.

As certified trainers, Mrs. Arnold and Mrs. Hubenthal are now qualified to teach the program curricula, and are working with district administrators to plan professional development programs for CV employees in a variety of job areas.

The program introduces participants to the unique risk factors and warning signs of mental health problems, and builds understanding of the importance of early intervention. By providing the training to employees in different jobs throughout the district, CV hopes to build awareness of mental health issues and how to identify them. The program also focuses on recognizing someone in crisis, and how/where to refer help.

"The idea is to train teachers, bus drivers, secretaries, really anyone who comes in contact with our students. We will teach them how to recognize and do a quick assessment, and then make a referral for the appropriate help," said Mrs. Arnold.

"It's not about doing therapy," she said. "It's about knowing who I can 'tag into' to assist while I stay in my lane."

Mrs. Arnold and Mrs. Hubenthal were able to attend the instructor training thanks to a funding initiative through New York State Senator Fred Akshar.

Wax Museum shows bring historical figures to life




A number of fourth grade students chose a famous person to research. Dressed as their selected person, they each gave a brief summary of that person's life in the school's "Wax Museum" shows.

Business Club Keyboarding Championship winners


