Message from the Superintendent

Dear Chenango Valley School Community,

I hope your summer is off to a great start! It's hard to believe that we've wrapped up the 2023-24 school year and are looking ahead to the fall. Thank you to our students, staff, and all parents and caregivers for a successful school year.

I want to highlight some remarkable accomplishments by our students this year, which wouldn't have been possible without your support. Overall, our chronic absenteeism rate decreased by 3.5% this year, with Port Dickinson leading the way with an incredible 7.1% reduction in students missing more than 19 days of school. Across the district, out-of-school suspensions dropped by 56% compared to last year. Additionally, the percent-



age of elementary students reading at or above grade level increased by nearly 5%. Most importantly, Chenango Valley achieved the highest graduation rate in our region, at 93% for the 2022-23 school year.

While celebrating these achievements, it's important to recognize areas where we can improve. Our office referrals remained flat compared to last year, and our in-school suspension rate was slightly higher. As we move further away from the peak of the COVID-19 pandemic, we will address issues related to device usage and student access to phones during instructional time. These efforts are crucial to enhancing our students' experiences at Chenango Valley.

Finally, I want to express my gratitude to the Chenango Valley school community for welcoming me in my first year as superintendent. Our district's sense of community, during both difficult times and successes, is truly remarkable. I look forward to continuing to grow as superintendent in my second year and collaborating with you to ensure our students have the best experience possible in our schools.

Please have a wonderful summer, and we eagerly await seeing you in the fall!

Capital Project Update

As we progress through the summer, our construction season is underway to complete the Capital Project approved by voters in December 2021. Significant progress was made during the summer of 2023, and this year brings even more exciting improvements.

At the CV Middle/High School, we are renovating spaces to create new art, technology, and family and consumer science classrooms. Additional upgrades include floor replacements, exterior door replacements, and pool equipment replacements. Most of the classroom furniture will be replaced by the end of the summer. For safety reasons, the building remains closed to the general public during these renovations.

Port Dickinson and Chenango Bridge Elementary Schools are receiving new standby generators and elevator upgrades. Additionally, we plan to start construction on the Port Dickinson Outdoor Learning Center near the pond at the rear of the site.

Annual Public Notice

The Chenango Valley Central School District has completed the inspection of all schools and buildings to determine the condition of asbestos that is present, and whether any action is required to avoid potential health hazards for students, employees, and visi-tors. A management plan has been developed in accordance with the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), to ensure the continued provision and maintenance of a safe environment for students, employees, and visitors. The management plan includes training of maintenance staff to prevent disturbance of asbestos, periodic re-inspection, and surveillance.

Please note that the comprehensive, triennial inspection occurs once every three years. A surveillance inspection of the asbestos containing building materials occurs every six months, typically during the months of December and July. Monitoring of these building materials occurs on a continuing basis. A copy of the management plan is available at the facilities office. 
