


CV COMMUNITY NIGHT MARCH 18TH

Women's History Month is dedicated to the accomplishments and achievements of women in the United States that are often overlooked. March is used as a time for reflection, appreciation and celebration of these women. This began as a local celebration in Santa Rosa, California in 1978 - choosing this month to correspond with March 8th, which is International Women's Day. After successfully lobbying for national recognition in 1980, President Jimmy Carter issued the first Presidential Proclamation declaring the week of March 8th, 1980 as National Women's History Week. By 1994, additional resolutions passed by congress eventually authorized the President to proclaim March of each year as Women's History Month.
