In addition to the school board election and school budget vote, district voters will be presented two (2) additional propositions on their ballots.

Prop. 2: Bus Bond Proposition



Voters will be asked to consider a proposition to purchase one (1) 66-passenger bus, one (1) 42-passenger wheelchair bus, and one (1) 35 passenger bus at a total cost not to exceed \$440,000.

The Chenango Valley Transportation Department has a fleet of approximately 36 vehicles. The long-range plan is to replace 3-4 vehicles each year as they reach 10 years and/or 100,000 miles. We are investigating electric buses for future purchases. According to current legislation, all NY school buses are to be zero-emission by 2035.

Transportation Aid Reimbursement

Bus purchases, including finance costs, are aided at the district's transportation aid ratio which is expected to remain at 90% in 2023-24.

The proposition will be worded as follows:

Shall the Chenango Valley Central School District, Broome County, New York, be authorized to purchase school buses, including costs incidental thereto, at a total maximum estimated cost of Four Hundred Forty Thousand Dollars (\$440,000), and that such sum shall be raised by the levy of a tax upon the taxable property of said School District to be collected in annual installments as provided by Section 416 of the Education Law; and in anticipation of such tax, obligations of said School District shall be issued?

Prop. 3: Library Levy Proposition



According to Section 529 of New York State Education Law, libraries within the boundaries of a school district have the right to place a separate funding proposition on the district's ballot. The law provides this as a means for libraries to access community voters and levy taxes. In May 2014, the Chenango Valley community participated in its first vote to support a proposition to provide annual funding to the Fenton Free Library. The Chenango Valley Board of Education was requested to add a proposition to the 2023 ballot to increase the annual funding to \$155,266.

It is important to note that library funds and school district funds remain separate, and the school district does not have any role in funding, operations, or management of the library.

The proposition will be worded as follows:

Shall the proposition be approved authorizing the Board of Education of the Chenango Valley Central School District to levy taxes annually in the amount of One Hundred Fifty-Five Thousand Two Hundred Sixty-Six Dollars (\$155,266) and to pay over such monies to the trustees of the Fenton Free Library for the purpose of funding the Fenton Free Library?

Message from the Board President and Interim Superintendent

Dear Chenango Valley Community,

We are pleased to present you with our proposal for the 2023-24 Chenango Valley Central School District budget. We are proud to present to you a fiscally responsible budget that embodies our mission of inspiring, engaging, and empowering all of our students to achieve their full potential.

The last several years have been a roller coaster ride as it relates to many things including state aid to school districts. Just a few years ago, as we were preparing the budget for the 2020-21 school year, we were anticipating potential mid-year state aid reductions that would have had a negative impact on staffing and programs if it came to fruition. Then, the following year, CV started receiving significant increases to our Foundation Aid as NYS moved closer to fully funding aid to those districts that have been historically underfunded. CV is expecting to

receive our full allocation of state aid in 2023-24 for the first time since 2007-08. As a result of this increase, the district will be able to retain many of the new positions that were implemented using the federal stimulus funding that is scheduled to end in June 2024.

This is the 12th year of calculating our property tax levy cap using the eight-step formula as prescribed by New York State. CV's calculated property tax levy limit increase for 2023-24 is a 2.02% increase from the current year tax levy. The average annual tax levy increase over the last 12 years is 1.76%.

The proposed budget continues our tradition of annual small capital outlay projects that generate building aid in the following year. Our first such project was completed in the 2013-14 school year, and we've scheduled these projects each year since then. This has resulted in the completion of \$1 million worth of projects with a local share of approximately \$15,000 per year. We invite and encourage all residents to attend the annual budget hearing/school board candidate forum on Wednesday, May 3, at 6:00 p.m. in the Chenango Valley Middle/High School library. The district budget vote and school board election will be held from 12:00 p.m. (noon) to 8:00 p.m. on Tuesday, May 16, in the Chenango Valley Middle/High School auditorium.

Absentee Ballots:

Absentee ballot applications may be obtained through the District Clerk by calling (607) 762-6810. Voters must verify eligibility and provide an eligible reason for their inability to vote in person. Absentee ballot applications must be received by the District Clerk at least seven (7) days before the vote set in this notice if the ballot is to be mailed to the absentee voter or the day before the vote if the ballot is to be delivered personally to the absentee voter. The returned ballot must be received no later than 5:00 p.m. on the day of the vote. The district will automatically mail absentee ballots to voters listed as "permanently disabled" on the Board of Election's list. For more information, please call the District Clerk at (607) 762-6810.

Voter Eligibility:

In order to vote at the School Budget Vote and Board Election:

- You must be a citizen of the United States
- · You must be at least 18 years of age
- You must NOT be prohibited from voting or from registering to vote pursuant to the provisions of Election Law § 5-106
- You must be a resident of Chenango Valley for at least thirty (30) days prior to the date of the vote (proof of residency is required: NYS driver's license, sheriff's ID card, senior citizen ID card, or utility bill indicating residency)
- You must be registered to vote with the Broome County Board of Elections

What if the Budget Doesn't Pass?

The Board of Education will either:

- (1) Make changes to the budget and hold a second vote. It should be noted that if the budget doesn't pass the second time, the only remaining option would be to adopt a contingency budget as outlined in number 2 below.
- (2) If a contingency budget is adopted, \$65,000 in equipment purchases would be eliminated and a total of \$358,325 in additional cuts would be made.

Annual Small Capital Outlay Project

The capital outlay project that the district completes every year has been very beneficial in allowing us to continue capital improvement work. These projects are capped at \$100,000, and the district receives aid back from New York State the following year. This is reflected in the budget as a "transfer to capital" of \$100,000. Our 2023-24 building aid ratio will be increasing to 89.8% resulting in a net cost of approximately \$10,200. For 2023-24, we are planning to replace lights in approximately 22 classrooms in the middle school with more energy efficient LED lighting.

Tax Levy Calculation and Impact

The calculated tax levy limit for the 2023-24 school year is 2.02%. The annual impact of this increase on a home valued at \$100,000 would be approximately \$51.

Every homeowner's tax bill is impacted by changes in equalization rates that are assigned by NYS to every town each summer prior to school tax bills being calculated. As a result of that change, each town in our school district will see a different impact on their tax bill depending on their town's change in equalization rate relative to other towns in the state. The 2021 capital improvements project has been designed, approved by the New York State Education Department, bid, and is now ready for construction to begin.

MS/HS CAMPUS CLOSED DUE TO CONSTRUCTION THIS SUMMER

Due to a lot of construction activity taking place, the Chenango Valley Middle/High School campus will be closed to the community for safety reasons during the summer months (after the senior graduation). Thank you for your understanding and cooperation.

Some things to look forward to!

- A majority of the CV Middle/High School parking areas will be completely reconstructed.
- An additional small parking area will be created near the softball field.
- Athletic site improvements include new tennis courts and installation of field lights at the multipurpose field as well as additional bleachers.
- Inside the CV Middle/High School building, there will be some renovations to existing spaces as well as ongoing replacement of the HVAC equipment, which is part of the stimulus project.

Summer construction work at Port Dickinson and Chenango Bridge Elementary Schools is not quite as extensive as the CV Middle/High School, but access will be restricted to certain areas.

This summer's construction will complete the first phase of the project, with the second phase occurring in the summer of 2024.

Pre-Construction Notification

The Chenango Valley Central School District anticipates conducting a construction project commencing on or about April 17, 2023. This project will be conducted at the following buildings:

The project will consist of the following:

- Port Dickinson Elementary: Project includes exterior door replacement, building rekeying, elevator upgrade, gym light replacement, gym sound system replacement, new emergency generator, toilet room upgrades, pavilion upgrades and exterior walkway and dock at pond.
- Middle School/High School: Project includes pavement reconstruction, parking expansion, tennis court replacement, new flagpole, new athletic field lights, exterior bleacher replacement, entrance sign replacement, exterior door replacement, roof coating, window replacement, masonry restoration, floor replacement, scoreboard replacement, door core replacement, new pool fans, chiller replacement, clock system replacement, sound system replacement, stage lighting replacement, fire alarm system replacement, fiber replacement, HWH replacement, spatial reconstruction and furniture replacement.
- Chenango Bridge Elementary: Project includes gym floor refinishing, door rekeying, elevator upgrade, water pipe replacement, gym light replacement, gym sound system replacement, and new emergency generator.
- Maintenance Storage Building: Project includes replacement of exterior wall panels, roof panels, and doors.
- Bus Garage: Project includes raising maintenance bay roof, new bus lift, new pressure washer and door core replacement.

Pursuant to Education Commissioner's Regulation 155.5(d), the Chenango Valley Central School District will provide a safe school environment throughout this project, including an update of the school emergency plan to reflect any temporary exits or procedures needed as a result of the construction work at the school facilities. Fire drills will be held to familiarize students and staff with any temporary exits. The construction area will be separated from occupied areas of the building, all construction workers will be required to wear photo identification badges, and noise levels will be kept to a minimum while the building is occupied. All applicable federal and State rules and regulations will be strictly adhered to throughout the length of this project.

Public Notice



Request for Pesticide Application Notification


New York State Education Law Section 409-H and State Education Department Commissioner's Regulation 155.24, effective July 1, 2001, requires all public and non-public elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the school year.

Chenango Valley Central School District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior notification of certain pesticide applications. The Prevention Coalition of Broome County is spreading awareness about the following items:

Script Safety - Medications are meant to be helpful but can be dangerous or even deadly if taken improperly or used by someone other than they were prescribed. Remember these tips at home to help keep others safe:

- Never tell children that medicine is candy to ease taking it. Medicines and vitamins are often mistaken as candy by children and can cause accidental poisonings.
- Teach medication safety at home. It is important to never take medication not prescribed to you and to take all medications exactly as directed by a doctor.
- Never leave medication out on a counter, table, or by a bedside. Secure all medications at home in a safe place, such as a locked cabinet or medication lock box.
- Properly dispose of unused, unwanted, or expired medications by bringing them to a local drop-off location (script-safety.com) or using a special deactivation bag.
- · Never share medications with anyone.
- Monitor all medications in the home by controlling access and tracking quantity and refills.






