

# Important Winter Weather Closing/Delay/Early Dismissal Information

Please take a moment to review Chenango Valley Central School District's winter weather closing, delay, and early dismissal procedures to help ensure the safety of our students, faculty, and staff. Careful regard for safety is made when considering snow, ice, and other weather-related delays or closings. Contact is made with local town highway departments, input from the National Weather Service is considered, and discussions are held with our transportation department and other area school districts.



#### **Notifications**

# The district will notify parents/caregivers through the following channels:

- Notifications for delays, closings, and early dismissals are:
- · Shared with local media.
- Sent through our automated calling system (these voice messages are sent to the phone numbers of students' primary contacts).
- Sent through the district's opt-in emergency alert system (which includes an email and/or text message alert notification). Please make sure that you are signed up for our opt-in text/email emergency alert notifications and that your information is updated. Visit www.cvcsd.stier.org/PortalLogin.aspx for details.
- Posted on our website (<u>www.cvcsd.stier.org</u>) and mobile app.

A <u>school closing</u> means that schools are closed for that calendar day.

When school is closed due to inclement weather, there will not be extracurricular activities such as meetings, practices, and contests.

With a <u>one- or two-hour delay schedule</u>, your child's school day will begin one or two hours after the regular start time. Dismissal times remain the same. If there is a two-hour delay in the morning, there are no AM pre-K classes. Full-day pre-K classes follow the two-hour delay schedule with dismissal at the normal full-day time.

In the event that a <a href="three-hour delay schedule">three-hour delay schedule</a> is utilized, your child's school day will start three hours after the usual start time with dismissal times staying the same. A three-hour delay schedule would be utilized only if weather conditions forecasted indicate a significant improvement that would allow road crews the time needed to make our roadways safe for travel. In addition, a three-hour delay may assist us in preventing changes to planned vacation days already on our school calendar. If there is a three-hour delay in the morning, there will be no AM pre-K classes. Full-day pre-K classes will follow a three-hour delay schedule with dismissal at the normal full-day time.

If there is an <u>early dismissal</u> due to potentially dangerous weather conditions, all extracurricular activities will be canceled. Please make sure that you have a plan in place for situations where your child may be released early.

The 2022-23 school year is off to a great start! continuing to see challenges due to the national and regional bus driver shortage. While we have started the school year with enough drivers to cover our routes, we are continuing our efforts to recruit more drivers to help prevent delays when there are absences. Chenango Valley has worked hard to attract and retain bus drivers over the past several years. In addition to advertising these openings through various channels, we have increased starting wages to \$17.97/hour, offer health insurance to all staff working over 20 hours per week, provide sign-on and referral bonuses, and reimburse permit and license fees. No experience is needed, and free training is available. # **COVID-19 Updates**

As a way to continue to keep families informed, we wanted to let you know how notifications for COVID-19 cases will be handled by each school building moving forward when there is a noted increase in cases. Our dedicated, hard-working nurses will create a baseline with a weekly average of positive cases for their building. If the numbers rise above two (2) additional positive cases per grade level within the building, they will generate a letter for their building to distribute to their families. This process has been reviewed with the Broome County Health Department. Our nurses are in discussion to do a similar process for other medical illnesses as well. Please remember: keep your child home if they are not feeling well, students and staff who choose to wear a mask are encouraged to do so, and COVID-19 test kits are available by contacting your child's school nurse. These are certainly accomplishments to be proud of!



#### **Attention Student-Athletes**

As you know, the NCAA has established eligibility rules related to participating in Division I and II college athletics. Should you be considering athletics in college, it is absolutely imperative that you notify your school counselor now. Students are required to take 16 core subject courses. The NCAA does not use elective courses to complete the 16.

To participate at the Division I or II level, you must also register with the NCAA Clearinghouse by going to <a href="www.eligibilitycenter.org">www.eligibilitycenter.org</a>. Once you have registered, it will prompt you to let the guidance office know so we can submit a transcript. Finally, you must submit your SAT or ACT scores to the NCAA Eligibility Center directly from the testing agency in order to certify the student-athlete's initial eligibility. All test scores are required to be sent.

# **REMINDER: Opt-In System for Alert Notifications**

In addition to the district updates sent through our student management system, the district provides an opt-in alert system to receive notifications regarding items such as district announcements, transportation, and emergency/weather-related closing alerts. These alert notifications will be sent in the form of an email and/or text message (depending on what you select). To receive these alert notifications, you will need to sign up for an account through our district website - <a href="https://www.cvcsd.stier.org">www.cvcsd.stier.org</a> ("Register for School Closings/Alert Messages" found at bottom of webpage) or via the district's mobile app.

- · Log in or create a new account.
- Select the notification preferences you would like to receive. To receive districtwide notifications such as emergencies and weather-related school closings, select "Emergency Alerts/Closing and Delay." For transportation updates, select "Transportation."

# **Important School Safety Reminders**

As the safety and security of our students and staff continues to be a top priority at the Chenango Valley Central School District, we ask you to please review and make sure you are familiar with the following district safety procedures/information:

- You must present photo identification to enter any of our school buildings. Visitors must also wear photo identification badges provided by the school. This applies to any event during school hours.
- As a safety protocol, visitors must enter the school building through the main security entrance during school hours. Students and staff are not to allow visitors in through any other outside entrances.
- Please be sure that your child knows what to do if they are sent home early due to an emergency or weather-related early dismissal.
- In the event of a crisis situation, please refrain from calling your child as the noise/distraction could put students in danger. Students must give their full attention to instructions from trained staff. Parents/caregivers should not rush to their child, as phone lines, staff and roads are vital for emergency response. In the event of a crisis, parents/caregivers should carefully monitor district information sources, which will include the reunification process (under the guidance of emergency responders). As a reminder, students will only be released to their parent/caregiver or a pre-designated emergency contact. Please be sure this information remains updated.
- Please know that each district decision is made with the safety of students and staff as our first priority. There are specific safety practices and procedures in place that have been carefully created by safety teams consisting of staff and emergency personnel. We will work to communicate available, accurate information as soon as possible. When applicable, we will provide consistent updates to keep parents/caregivers best informed throughout the process.
- We thank you for your cooperation and support in helping to keep our students safe. Please reach out to your building principal with any questions.

#### In the event of an emergency situation, Chenango Valley Schools will initiate the appropriate safety response(s):

#### Shelter-in-Place

Used to shelter students and staff inside the building.

#### Hold-In-Place

Used to limit movement of students and staff while dealing with short-term emergencies.

#### Evacuate

Used to evacuate students and staff from the building.

#### Lockout

Used to secure school building and grounds during incidents that pose an imminent concern outside of the school.

#### Lockdown


Used to secure school buildings and grounds during incidents that pose an immediate threat of violence in or around the school.






